**April 2024.**

The weather has been hot for the start of Autumn, with mostly sunny skies and above average temperatures but no significant rainfall. Visitors have continued to travel onto the Peninsula and into Stansbury during March and, with Easter weekend, school holidays and Anzac Day approaching, late March and April will prove to be as busy as ever.

It was very unfortunate that the decision had to be made by the Progress Association to cancel the 9 March market, due to very hot temperatures and wind forecast, which would have made for a very unpleasant morning for all.

The Progress Association has a bad weather policy to ensure the safety and comfort of stallholders and patrons. If weather conditions forecasted 2 days prior to the market date exceed the bad weather policy, then the market is cancelled. This allows stallholders adequate notice to make other arrangements, particularly those preparing food or travelling long distances to attend.

We are optimistic that the weather will be kind for us for the Easter market on Saturday 30 March 2024 from 9am to 1pm. Over 70 stallholders and so much variety ... it's a market not to be missed. And the Lions Club of Stansbury Dalrymple is holding their annual raffle, so please support this wonderful community organisation and buy a donut or two and a raffle ticket or two!

### **Saltwater Classic Wooden Boat Regatta.**

It is very exciting to have the Saltwater Classic Regatta back for the first time since 2018. The event will be held on 13 and 14 April, between Stansbury and Port Vincent. On Saturday 13 April, Stansbury will host the last Seaside market for the season, from 9am to 1pm, and it is set to be huge. Over 65 stallholders, with their usual great variety of produce and goods. The Stansbury Museum is holding their annual raffle at this market. They've got a wonderful basket of goodies, so please make sure, while you're grabbing your breakfast, that you buy a raffle ticket or two.

There will also be a foreshore display of classic boats, cars, hot rods, and motorbikes from local areas and further afield. The Blacksmiths will be on hand with a display and sales on the foreshore near the Caravan Park. As well as all this, there'll be stationary engines and machinery on display, plus a large collection of vintage caravans, to view in the Foreshore Park and model boats displayed on the foreshore.

A Navy Band will entertain market goers, plus at 10am, the arrival of the Hot Rods will make their way through town. At 12 noon, human powered craft will depart Stansbury to Port Vincent Marina and the launch of the remaining classic boats at Stansbury Boat Ramp.

At 12.30pm, the arrival of Brindabella and the One and All at Stansbury will accompany the fleet to Port Vincent (subject to weather). At 2pm, all vessels will be assembled and will depart to Port Vincent along the south side of the main jetty. A bag piper will signal the boats' departure. At 2.30pm, hydroplanes (if weather permits), will drive past the Stansbury Boat Ramp.

The best viewing areas for the on water fleet are Stansbury boat ramp and jetty and Mills Gully Lookout, Wow, what a day it'll be in Stansbury!

## **RECYCLING**

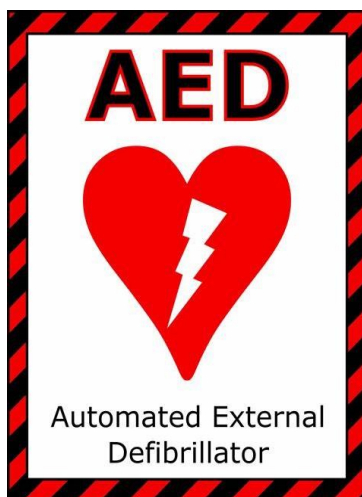
To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods:** Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda. *No hypodermic needles please.*

**Soft plastics:** These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed*. Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

About how many kilometres are flown by RFDS aircraft nationwide in one year?

What about thirty-five times to the Moon and back..... that's about 27,286,414 km! Written out, that's: Twenty-seven million, Two hundred and eighty-six thousand, Four hundred and fourteen kilometres!



Did you know the Medi-Jet 24 can transport three stretchered patients at once?



Across Australia, how often does the RFDS interact with a patient? Every 2 minutes? Every 5 minutes? Every 10 minutes? Every 20 minutes?

How many emergency roadway airstrips are there in Australia? About 6+.

In South Australia there are 2 – one on the Stuart Highway between Port Augusta and the NT border, and one on the Eyre Highway between Port Augusta and the WA border.

Did you know that the RFDS Australia-wide has the same number of aircraft as Jetstar? True.

RFDS South Australia/Northern Territory fly two types of aircraft. Do you know what they are?

They are both built by Pilatus – the PC-12 (with a turbo-prop) and the twin jet PC-24 (pictured above).

## STANSBURY MUSEUM

As Anzac Day approaches and with major conflicts currently occurring overseas, it is an appropriate time to remind ourselves of the commitment of our servicemen and women both those currently serving and those who served our country in the past.

“Lest We Forget!”

The town of Stansbury has significant places that honour their service like the War Memorial, the Institute and the Memorial gates at the oval and at the museum.

Stansbury Museum has an area devoted to honouring servicemen by telling their stories and showcasing their service and experiences both at home and overseas. It has a display showing wartime artefacts including a hand grenade, old flask, goggles, a stake and piece of sleeper from the infamous Burma railway, an Australian Women’s Army Signal Corps uniform worn by a local lady from 1980 -1986, a helmet and RAAF cap. It also has an impressive pair of trench art candlesticks made from shell casings. Much more recent service is displayed from Mark Duncan,( a local family’s son), when he was in Iraq in 2006. He was involved with the Bushmaster when it was a very new vehicle for the Australian Army. This is immortalised in a painting in the Australian War Memorial.

There is also a large collection of books covering many different times (e.g World Wars 1 & 2, Vietnam, Korea) and topics (e.g WW2 tanks, women, preserving war heritage, memories) and also different styles (eg photographic, memoirs, collections of letters written home and even a pictorial honour roll). There is an interesting newspaper page from Smith’s Weekly, January 4<sup>th</sup> 1941 with photographs titled “Australians at War 1940”. Some of the books are specifically relevant to Stansbury and the Yorke Peninsula like “Pens and Bayonets” - letters from the front by Soldiers of Yorke Peninsula during the Great War”.

Another very special publication is a booklet titled “Memorial Mysteries” which was researched and written by the staff and students of Port Vincent Primary in 1999- 2000. Interestingly, it mentions a newspaper cutting dating from 4<sup>th</sup> August 1919 that records that Private Stan Germein wrote to his mother at Stansbury from the Al Hayet Hospital in Egypt. In his letter he mentions being on an excursion organised by the Red Cross society and going to the Nile in carriages and then crossing the river on a pontoon with donkeys which he described as “these noble animals”. What a world away from the Yorke Peninsula of his homeland he was!

The museum also tells the history of the Stansbury sub branch of the RSL which had it’s origins with the formation of a group of Stansbury returned service men who formed a club in 1949 called “Diggers”. It set about fundraising and in 1951 the Stansbury group was presented with its own charter. There is historic RSL memorabilia, an early flag and a unique gong made of a shell casing that was used to call the meetings to order.

“At the going down of the sun and in the morning, we will remember them!”
