To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around</u> the town, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.



STANSBURY MUSEUM August 2024

This month marks the 100th anniversary of the Stansbury Golf Club's formation.

To celebrate this achievement, this article is devoted to the Stansbury Golf Club. I would like to acknowledge the work of many other Stansbury community volunteers who collated and wrote down the information which I have used to collate and create this article.

The sport of golf originated in medieval times on the east coast of Scotland where it was played on coastal dunes and tracks hitting a pebble with a stick. The oldest golf course is considered to be the "Old Course" at St Andrew's, Scotland which has been played on since 1552. Many, many years later and many kilometres away the Stansbury Golf Club was formed.

The initial meeting of the golf club held on July 28th 1924 decided to ask the District Council of Yorke Peninsula for the use of part of the parklands for a 9 hole golf course. Soon after, the club elected a committee presided over by AP Anderson. It had a foundation membership of 35 local men and women and the inaugural club captain was Charles Peterson.

In the early days, members spent many hours picking the small round stones off the fairways. Sheep were used to mow the grass. To keep the sheep off the blacks (Stansbury's equivalent of putting greens), they were surrounded by iron droppers with wire. Fairways were marked with a single furrow dug in the ground prior to the first game. Although bordered by trees along the oval fence line, the course itself originally had very few trees.

By the late 1920's the club had joined the S.Y.P Golf Association and were playing Association matches. The first ladies committee was formed in 1928 and there were 17 lady members. They held the very successful Golf Ball in 1928 at the Institute which became an annual fundraiser for many years. Membership numbers fluctuated in the following decade probably due to the Great Depression but even so in 1937 the first clubhouse was built. It was built of galvanised iron near the corner of the parklands near the oval. It measured 16 foot (4877mm) by 10 foot (3048mm) and was 8 foot (2438mm) high.

WW2 saw golf go into recession and it took some years afterwards for it to recover. The 1950's however marked a resurgence of interest and the club really took off again. Some notable achievements were

- 1951 the Stansbury team remained undefeated
- 1952 a prominent Adelaide golfer, Bruce Auld played an exhibition round and drew a crowd of keen golfers
- 1959 a new clubhouse was built on top of the hill where it is today and the old clubhouse was donated to the Basketball Club (an aside, it wasn't until 1970 that women's basketball became known as netball).

The new clubhouse that was officially opened in April 1960, was a huge improvement as it had toilets, a kitchen area, a Captain's room and even a fridge for bottled beer. Earlier days had seen a bar set up in a tent on Open days. By 1970, even with adjustments, this clubhouse no longer coped with the increased membership so it was significantly enlarged. It now had the large glass frontage that takes in Stansbury's glorious views and also had a bar holding a larger range of drinks and also golf accessories. Interestingly, it also had room for a dartboard and the club had a team in the winter inter-town darts which was reputedly quite competitive. Over subsequent years, many improvements have been made to this building and its facilities, the most recent being the major upgrade of the kitchen.

In 1983, a company was employed to redesign the course but due to budget restrictions this didn't proceed until a couple of hard working, savvy volunteers found the original map and began to organise and make gradual changes like tree planting, digging sand traps, adding mounds and moving tee blocks. This resulted in the course becoming much more challenging.

The Stansbury Golf Club has continued to thrive over subsequent years due to significant effort by many volunteers (too many to name individually). A relatively recent innovation has been the addition of the Stansbury Golf Masters to the yearly calendar which includes a live broadcast of the Triple M Rush Hour crew's radio show from the clubrooms on the day. Another new initiative is "Bubbles and Bash" on Friday afternoons, a social and easy going environment to learn for new lady golfers and also for existing lady golfers to improve their skills. The monthly, winter dinner fundraiser also continues to be very popular.

With approximately 50 members now, after 100 years, the Stansbury Golf Club continues to be a vibrant entity in the Stansbury Community.
