Recycling:

NEPRESSO: Many of you will have a Nespresso coffee pod machine at home, in your caravan or holiday home. The used pods are recyclable and the Visitor Centre has a box to put them in. **Only the Nespresso brand pods can be collected for recycling.** The reason for this is that they are made entirely from Aluminium (unlike some other brands, apparently). You can collect your pods in any sort of container, which can be placed in the box, but when you order or purchase your next coffee pods, check out the recycling bag available from Nespresso.

The white plastic cube in the yard at the side of the Centre is for you to place any dry, flat-packed newspapers, cardboard (secured with string) etc. for recycling. If the container is full, please leave your paper bundles under the shelter.

Soft plastics can also be placed in the container, but it is important that these are **clean and appropriately packed**, or this service will be discontinued. It is important to recycle as much as we can to reduce the amount of rubbish going into landfill so if you are unable to deliver your papers to the yard, please place in your yellow recycling bin

Please note that our Centre does not have a facility for bottles and cans.

Stansbury has a bottle and can recycling depot - "Stansbury Recycling" - for all your refundable items and glass bottles. Alternatively, they can be placed in the "cages" dotted around town and the blue and yellow bins in the Caravan Parks, the proceeds of which are distributed to those community groups and sporting clubs who participate in the collection.

The Visitor Information Centre has a "Planet Ark" recycling box for all your used printer cartridges as well as a container for recycling the following items:

Please note that we no longer accept plastic screw lids or any Colgate products.

We will still be able to recycle:

- The little plastic bread bag sealers.
- Aluminium can pull tabs.
- All blister packs.
- Used biros – no ink.

A limited number of the "Scribble" is printed and made available from the town businesses and the Visitor Centre. For those who prefer, it is available to read online at www.stansburysa.com or, if you miss out and don't have internet access, you can always come into the Visitor Information Centre and pick up a copy. In the event of cardiac arrest, emergency defibrillators are available in the following locations:

- Foreshore Caravan Park, on the outside wall of the office to the left of the door.
- Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, on the outside of the small, red brick building adjacent to the entrance to the park.
- Stansbury Pharmacy, on the outside, eastern wall.
- Stansbury Bowling Club, on the club house wall, facing the greens.
- Stansbury Golf Club, on the front veranda of the club rooms.

These are automated and instructions are provided so please don't be afraid to use one. *You could save a life!*

LIONS CLUB OF STANSBURY DALRYMPLE

“Did you know that eating a Christmas Cake can prevent blindness?”

This is a quote from a TV ad in 1992 referring to Lions SAVE SIGHT project.

Some facts about the Lions Christmas Cakes

Raised over \$60 million dollars for worthy causes since 1965 when launched.

Where it all began...

Observed in operation in Canada, the idea was brought back to Australia and trialed. Originally thought a ‘crazy idea’, the Lions Christmas cake became an instant success. Initially baked by Big Sister, the recipe has remained basically the same, though the shape has changed due to metric measurements. Currently Traditional Foods are the bakers and the Lions Christmas Cake is their biggest bake job.

The larger cakes take 2 – 3 hours to bake, and on average 8,000 cakes are baked each day. All cakes contain at least 50% fruit. While Australian products make up 49% of the ingredients, supply shortages and/or excessive costs prevent this being higher at the moment.
