

## **RECYCLING**

To help keep our town beautiful, and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

**Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

**Soft plastics:** These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed*. Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located</u> <u>around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling have a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

The Visitor Centre is also able to receive little plastic bread bag sealers, aluminium can pull tabs and used biros – no ink. **However, we are no longer able to accept plastic screw lids, Colgate products or blister packs.** Unfortunately, we are not able to recycle batteries.

#### **EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATORS:**

In the event of cardiac arrest emergency defibrillators are situated at the following locations:

- Foreshore Caravan Park on the outside wall of the office to the left of the door.
- Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, on the outside of the small red brick building adjacent to the entrance of the park.
- Stansbury Pharmacy on the outside, eastern wall.
- Stansbury Bowling Club on the club house wall facing the greens.
- Stansbury Golf Club on the front veranda of the club rooms.

These are automated and instructions are provided so please don't be afraid to use one. You could save a life!

#### STANSBURY MUSEUM

This month's offering is something totally different but still with an Australian historical bent. A group of us from Stansbury recently returned from Norfolk Island – a place renowned for its natural beauty, friendly people, unique history and connections to Australia, New Zealand, England and Polynesia. Its tourism and the Islanders lifestyle celebrate the island's historic past.

The Kingston and Arthurs Vale Historic Area of Norfolk Island is a World Heritage site. It is considered one of Australia's most interesting and important sites, not only for convict history but also for Polynesian and Pitcairn Island history. It is a community that lives and breathes its history with respect and great pride. As a visitor to this beautiful island, it is impossible not to be touched and feel the continuing impact of the original settlers, the convicts, the military and the Pitcairn Islanders who were descendants of the Bounty mutineers, Polynesians and whalers. These are the people who made Norfolk Island what it is today.

#### Some interesting facts

Convicts on Norfolk Island were only ever issued with one set of clothes. If they got damaged or if you were "fortunate" to survive long enough for them to wear out and disintegrate then that was tough luck.

The Norfolk Island Golf club house is located in the heritage listed house at No 1 Quality Row which was formerly the home of the stipendiary magistrate. It was built by convicts in the Georgian style of limestone guarried on the island and local timber.

The first British settlement on Norfolk Island began only 6 weeks after the arrival of the First Fleet. The British were determined to stake claim to the island to ensure its resources did not fall into French hands.

There are 7 museums on the island as well other historical displays —each with a unique offering and insight into the island's history. It is a very historically dense and rich environment.

Norfolk Island has an impressive and proud tradition of military service. It is especially remarkable as it is such a tiny island. It is less than 100<sup>th</sup> the size of Kangaroo Island with a population not quite 5 times that of Stansbury. Over half of the eligible Islanders volunteered to fight in World War 1. Norfolk Islanders have served in every war and peacekeeping operation since the Boer War.

There are no snakes, rabbits or foxes on Norfolk Island.

The Pitcairn Islanders relocated to Norfolk Island in 1856 after their island became unable to sustain the increasing population. An important item families brought with them was their yollo, a slab of volcanic rock with criss cross grooves used to grate green bananas and root vegetables in preparation for cooking. As well as the Polynesian influence, Norfolk Island cooking also was influenced by the wives of American whalers who adapted traditional custard pies using local ingredients.

From the mid 1930's until World War 2, the popular Cottees drink, Passiona was made with passionfruit pulp from Norfolk Island.

The second language of Norfolk Island is "Norfolk", an amalgam of 18<sup>th</sup> century English and Polynesian.

Anyone who has an interest in Australian history would love to visit Norfolk Island. Our Stansbury group can attest to this. In addition, the beautiful natural environment and the sense of the community is reminiscent of Stansbury although at this time of year our environment is golden and Norfolk is emerald green.

Wishing everyone peace and joy at Christmas and always.
