# RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful, and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

**Soft plastics:** These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed*. Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the</u> town, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling have a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

The Visitor Centre is also able to receive little plastic bread bag sealers, aluminium can pull tabs and used biros – no ink. However, we are no longer able to accept plastic screw lids, Colgate products or blister packs. Unfortunately, we are not able to recycle batteries.

#### **EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATORS:**

In the event of cardiac arrest emergency defibrillators are situated at the following locations:

- Foreshore Caravan Park on the outside wall of the office to the left of the door.
- Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, on the outside of the small red brick building adjacent to the entrance of the park.
- Stansbury Pharmacy on the outside, eastern wall.
- Stansbury Bowling Club on the club house wall facing the greens.
- Stansbury Golf Club on the front veranda of the club rooms.

# STANSBURY MUSEUM

I invite you walk through the museum entrance into the large room that is currently used to orientate visitors to the history of Stansbury and stand still on the worn floor boards. Close your eyes and imagine!

Imagine the many local children of years ago who began their education in this room, hear their chatter and laughter and hear their teachers imparting knowledge and discipline to boys and girls, some of whom stayed in the local area and contributed to the community here and others who travelled afar and made their mark elsewhere.

Stansbury School was opened on 6<sup>th</sup> November 1878 with 48 pupils ranging from 4 to 16 who previously had had no schooling. Miss Grace Kerr was head teacher for the majority of the time the school existed on the current museum site (1882 -1902). Student numbers fluctuated but were generally high. In 1907 there were 67 so the school gualified for an assistant teacher.

By 1907 Education Department inspectors condemned the school for student use and school was transferred to the original Stansbury Institute in St Vincent Street, until the new school was built in its current location.

The museum displays many school photos dating right back to 1878 up to current times. In 1878 a very solemn group of students is standing in front of the school with the smaller ones sitting crossed legged in front of them and flanked by Miss Grace Kerr. She looked quite severe in her full length dark dress with white pinafore. In a close up head and shoulders and later portrait of the head teacher she is unsmiling but looks less severe. In the formal school photo the girls wore mid calf frocks with pinafores or smocks. The lads wore jackets, collared shirts and button up boots and many are holding their hats. Interestingly in the 1892 photo neither the girls nor Miss Kerr are wearing pinafores and many students are wearing hats and caps or bonnets almost as though they've just arrived at school or are about to go on an excursion. The photos chronicle the change in fashions and hairstyles over the years, some with school uniforms, others more individual.

It is also interesting to compare the photos of the Stansbury School Fife and Drum band, one in 1946 and the other in the mid 1960's. The students in the 1960's photo were clearly encouraged to smile and the fife players held their instruments and in the 1946 photo the fife players were posed as if ready to play their instruments and so in that photo only two of the drummers were smiling.

It is interesting to look through the student names in the photos and recognise many surnames that still resonate through the district today. Many of today's locals could stand in that room and imagine their distant relatives learning their letters and numbers in that classroom with Miss Kerr and with other teachers in the current school location.

As with today, the Stansbury School and its staff has always been an important and integral part of the Stansbury community.
