RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods:** Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.



Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.
No hypodermic needles please.

Soft plastics: These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed*. Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.



This month's article is a self indulgent contribution that has a museum and historical flavour. Traveling to the United Kingdom via Singapore gave me the opportunity to have a taste of museums in different countries.

The hotel we stayed at in Singapore was itself a museum of sorts. It was originally the Fort Cannning Barracks –a strategic military base during World War 2. The reception had interesting glass panels in the floor that showed artefacts including pottery and china set against excavated earth that had been discovered during work done to repurpose the building as a hotel. The park surrounding the hotel has other military landmarks including an underground bunker. It is also very close to the Singapore Museum which tells the story of this time in history amongst so many other aspects of Singapore's history and cultural heritage.

In London, we continued the same theme and visited the Imperial War Museum which, as well as a focus on military history, has a strong focus on the social effects of London and the United Kingdom. It also tells the story of the Jewish refugees fleeing from the Nazis to the UK. The Imperial War Museum was founded during World War 1 to make sure we never forget what it is like to live in a world torn apart by conflict.

A trip to Cornwall took us to St Germans and its Norman Church. The kind people of St Germans opened their hearts and their homes to evacuees from South London during World War 2, two of whom were my parents. The St Germans Priory which has stood for centuries is still a functioning church. It has clearly moved with the times as the previous evening it was the location for a gig by a harmonic indie band.

When visiting Wales we were impressed with two very different museums sponsored by the Welsh Government. The Big Pit National Coal Museum lets you experience the atmosphere of a real coal mine and to get a glimpse of what life was like for the men who worked the coal face. The tour takes you 90 metres underground to the level where the pit ponies were stabled. At one time, 200 ponies worked and lived in this mine pulling heavy tubs of coal. It was said that these ponies had a better life than the small children as young as six who contributed to their families' income by working as door openers in the pitch black mines, terrifying and dangerous places for them.

St Fagans National Museum of History which started in 1948 consists of historical buildings moved from all over Wales. They are arranged in a pleasant working farm environment with lots of space for children to play, families to picnic and spots to sit and contemplate the rich history that surrounds you. There are craftsmen plying old trades like clog making and blacksmithing. There is an old red farmhouse built in 1610. It was painted red to protect it from evil spirits. There are many other buildings including a bakehouse, shops, tailor, police station, war memorial, churches, woollen mill, a prefabricated house from the 1950's, barn, pub and a cock fighting ring. Even The Workman's Institute built in Caerphilly in 1917 had been faithfully relocated. It was a focal place for social and community life in this mining area. It had a library, recreation rooms, cinema and educational classrooms for the miners.

My personal favourite was the row of 5 terraced houses completed with historically accurate gardens that were furnished "through the ages" showing how furnishings, amenities and gardens have changed as the years progressed.

One of this impressive museum's pamphlets said
" Amgueddfa Cymru (English translation- Museum Wales) belongs to everyone .Play your part in Wales' Story: by volunteering, joining or donating today."

I believe this statement could equally be translated to Stansbury Museum. Many of the interesting things we saw were made so much more meaningful by the contributions of volunteers who were truly playing their part in telling the story.
