It was another perfect autumn day, and the foreshore was full of market stalls, the Navy Band, vintage cars, motorbikes, boats, and caravans, all the way from the top corner of Anzac Parade to the Caravan Park. It was a colourful spectacle, particularly when the One and All and Brindabella made an appearance on the horizon, and the boats launched on their journey up the coast to Port Vincent. It was a wonderful event, and well supported by the many visitors who strolled through the displays, and down onto the boat ramp throughout the day.

Congratulations to the Saltwater Classic organising committee on arranging this fantastic weekend. It was such a spectacle and so well managed both before and on the day. Well done everyone.

Rob Tonkin, who generously donates his time and talents to all our markets busking for various charities, raised \$530.45 for RFDS at the Easter Saturday Market and \$433.05 for Prostate Cancer at the Saltwater Classic market 13 April. We always love hearing Rob play at our markets, and he has raised an amazing \$2,402.45 for 6 different charities over the 6 markets he attended this season. You do a fantastic job, and we really appreciate your commitment and support

RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda. *No hypodermic needles please*.

Soft plastics: These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed.* Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.




