RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful, and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

Soft plastics: These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed*. Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling have a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

The Visitor Centre is also able to receive little plastic bread bag sealers, aluminium can pull tabs and used biros – no ink. **However, we are no longer able to accept plastic screw lids, Colgate products or blister packs.** Unfortunately, we are not able to recycle batteries.

EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATORS:

In the event of cardiac arrest emergency defibrillators are situated at the following locations:

- Foreshore Caravan Park on the outside wall of the office to the left of the door.
- Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, on the outside of the small red brick building adjacent to the entrance of the park.
- Stansbury Pharmacy on the outside, eastern wall.
- Stansbury Bowling Club on the club house wall facing the greens.
- Stansbury Golf Club on the front veranda of the club rooms.

These are automated and instructions are provided so please don't be afraid to use one. *You could save a life!*

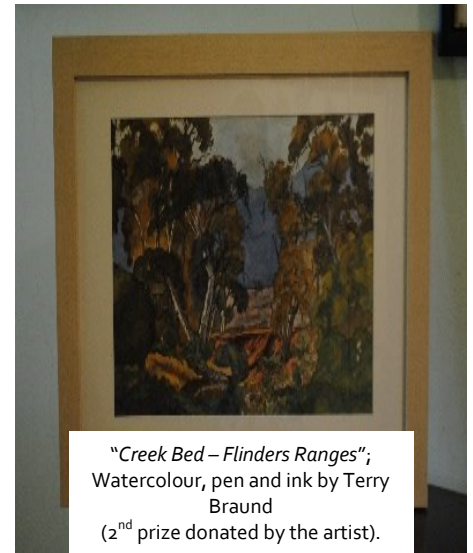

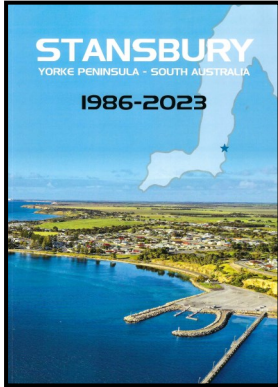

CFS – FROM THE CAPTAIN’S DESK

FIRE DANGER SEASON HAS STARTED!

The Chief Officer of the South Australian Country Fire Service, having considered fuel load, curing rates, predicted weather etc... has determined that the Fire Danger season for the Yorke Peninsula will run from **November 1, 2023 to April 30, 2024**.

This is 2 weeks earlier than normal. Spread the word to your neighbours and friends!

For more information on fire danger season, permits and information go to cfs.sa.gov.au and click on “Fire Danger Season dates & permits”

What to expect this Fire Danger Season:

With winter now well behind us and an “El Nino” weather event underway, we can anticipate a very dry summer and combined with high fuel loads from previous wet winters, this fire season has the potential to be “catastrophic”.

Definition: a “catastrophic” fire danger day means that there are not enough resources available within South Australia (volunteers, water, fire appliances, aircraft) to control a fire should one get out of control.

This being the case, we ask that everyone ensures that as much combustible material as possible is moved away from houses and sheds etc. and that all vacant blocks are cleared. It sounds crazy, but I have seen it with my own eyes – kids bicycles on verandas and coir door mats can trap embers and houses have been lost as a result.

The CFS does produce an excellent bushfire information booklet titled “Your guide to bushfire safety”. It provides comprehensive information on the things you can do to keep you and your family as safe as possible during a bushfire emergency. Stocks of these booklets are available from the Stansbury Visitor Information Centre.

CFS Alarms and Sirens:

At the beginning of November our Brigade will start training every Tuesday night. This change of training nights (it used to be Monday) will encourage more members to attend. As of then, our siren will be tested weekly at 7:30 pm. The Siren test will be a short double rise and fall in pitch and is no cause for alarm...

There are two (2) other occasions when the siren will be used.

If we are short of crew members to attend the truck – we will use the siren for approx. 30 seconds. When the siren is activated in this way, a pager message is also sent to our members as a call to action. (They do not need to be within hearing distance of the siren).

Prolonged operation of the siren will be notification of a town emergency and residents should activate their action plans or follow the steps below:

In the event of a major incident in Stansbury...

Keep informed using the ABC Adelaide radio station, the Alert SA app, social media, any emergency services, and the Information Hotline ([1800 362 361](tel:1800362361) which will provide a recorded message). Don't rely on just one source of information.

Act early! If an evacuation centre is announced, or you have a safe place to go away from the fire, make your way to it early. Leaving it until later can make it too late. In the Yorketown fire of 2019 residents at Edithburgh were encouraged to evacuate to Stansbury Bowling Club where meals, comfort and services such as Red Cross were available - if Stansbury were under threat it would likely be a neighbouring town returning that hospitality.

If it is too late to evacuate safely, Stansbury's “Places of Last Resort Refuge” are the Footy/Cricket Oval, the Bowling Club, or if necessary the beach.

Definition: A “place of last resort refuge” does not guarantee safety. It is the last resort when the opportunity to safely evacuate has passed.

The Future of Stansbury CFS

As with all volunteer organisations – we are always looking for new members. Our role in the Stansbury Community is much more than fighting fires. It can range to rescuing cats from trees, road accident rescue, assisting SA Ambulance or SES. We are often the first responders to any community emergency. So, if you have an emergency and dial 000 – the chances are that it will be the Stansbury CFS that arrives first.

If you would want to be assured that somebody will be available to respond in an emergency to assist somebody significant in your life (for example, you, your partner, your child or your parents), perhaps you should consider volunteering – we can't always rely on others to do the heavy lifting.

There are a wide range of skills to be learned, with great training provided and a great, supportive team to work with.

One thing you can do right now...

To make emergency services job easier **CHECK THAT YOUR HOUSE NUMBERS ARE CLEARLY VISIBLE AND LARGE ENOUGH TO BE READ FROM THE ROAD.** Please use contrasting colours (for example – white on a black background). From experience it can be very frustrating looking for house numbers, when response time is of the utmost importance.,

The Stansbury 150th was a wonderful celebration of our town. South Australia’s Barossa Valley has some of the world’s oldest grape vines dating back 170 years. In the early days, the area around Stansbury had some commercial vineyards but after some years grape growing in Stansbury was deemed unviable.

The Adelaide Botanic Gardens have the largest single span glasshouse (the Bicentennial Conservatory) and one of the oldest glasshouses in the Southern Hemisphere (the Palm House). The Palm House is thought to be the only surviving example of a pre-fabricated glasshouse in the world. It was built and imported from Bremen, Germany in 1875 and reassembled and completed in 1877 after all the glass panes were broken during shipping

In 18th Century England, pineapples were a status symbol. The extremely rich would actually carry them around to show off their wealth and status.

During the Depression in Australia and the USA, people used cotton flour bags to make clothes, back quilts and make other household items. Manufacturers began to realise that people were using them for other uses and began to add colour and patterns that enhanced them for when they were recycled kindness in difficult times for so many people but no doubt also helped the sale of their product.
