The town has been buzzing with so much activity over the past few months and our volunteers have been working overtime making sure the town looks as good as it can for this very important celebration. #### RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful, and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

**Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

**Soft plastics:** These can also be placed in the cube if they are *clean and appropriately packed.* Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located</u> <u>around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling have a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

The Visitor Centre is also able to receive little plastic bread bag sealers, aluminium can pull tabs and used biros – no ink. **However, we are no longer able to accept plastic screw lids, Colgate products or blister packs.** Unfortunately, we are not able to recycle batteries.

#### **EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATORS:**

In the event of cardiac arrest emergency defibrillators are situated at the following locations:

- Foreshore Caravan Park on the outside wall of the office to the left of the door.
- Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, on the outside of the small red brick building adjacent to the entrance of the park.
- Stansbury Pharmacy on the outside, eastern wall.
- Stansbury Bowling Club on the club house wall facing the greens.
- Stansbury Golf Club on the front veranda of the club rooms.

These are automated and instructions are provided so please don't be afraid to use one. You could save a life!

#### STANSBURY INSTITUTE MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2022-2023

We welcomed Cynthia Morony and Del Balkalkaus to our committee. It has not been necessary to hold any meetings during the past year as there have been no major projects or issues. With the day to day running of the hall requiring only the occasion text message to members for information and approval of minor problems. Our main purchases have been to replace the vacuum cleaner, thanks to Progress and a new urn.

Our hall has been hired on a regular basis to different groups during the year including the local Lions Club, RSL sub-branch, Tai Chi Group, aerobics class, and various monthly meetings. There were also special events like the winter mini market, pop up clothing shop, the primary school concert, Anzac Day Breakfast, funeral services and wakes. Total bookings for the year were 102, not including the weekly doctors' visits.

The only upgrade during the year has been the replacement, of the library carpet by the Yorke Peninsula Council. The library has also been revamped and is now more spacious with easier access for patrons. Unfortunately the front foyer door frame still has not been sealed but we hope to have it done shortly. Patrons often comment on the excellent condition of the main hall floor surface. The new door seals on both main side doors it has reduced the amount of dirt and leaves inside the building. Thank you to the Tidy Towns Group for fitting them.

Lee Wilson our cleaner/caretaker continues to keep the whole building in a pristine condition and is always doing extra to make the place friendlier and more inviting which people do notice and appreciate.

Thank you to the Yorke Peninsula Council, Progress Association and Tidy Towns Group for their continued help. Thanks to all the Committee members for their commitment and support.

We wish to acknowledge the contribution of Graham Newstead to the Committee, as our secretary and committee member for the past 8 years. He will be sadly missed.

#### STANSBURY MUSEUM Rowena Smith

The Stansbury Museum was officially opened on the 8<sup>th</sup> January 1976. The establishment of the museum was a direct result of interest shown during the Stansbury Centenary celebrations 50 years ago in 1973. At this time, items of historical interest were displayed at the Bowling Club. Later they were transferred to the current museum building which is a historical gem itself. It was built in 1878 by the government as a schoolroom with a dwelling attached.

Now, during the Stansbury 150<sup>th</sup> celebrations the Stansbury Museum is proud to be an integral part of those celebrations and background support to the organisers. This background support by volunteers has involved many hours of searching archives for information and photos.

The "**Historic Walks of Stansbury**" booklet has been rewritten and updated. The printing costs have been generously sponsored by Tech Dry with all profits of the sale of the booklet to go to the Museum. The booklet will be available for purchase at the Museum, the Visitor Centre and at the Official Opening of the Stansbury 150<sup>th</sup> at the Bowls Club on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> September (ticketed event).

#### The Cemetery Directory will be proudly launched at the Stansbury Cemetery on Sunday 1<sup>st</sup> October 2023 at 11am.

It has been a massive project by a large number of volunteers. The research has been ongoing for many years. It has been a huge undertaking to collate the information and translate it to two directory signs for the cemetery that will list all those interred there. It has involved liaison with many other parties. Costs of the signs have been met by significant and generous donations by the local Lions Club and RSL and by private donors. Everyone is welcome to join us at the Cemetery Directory Launch which is being combined with the laying of the Time Capsule.

## NEW FEES FROM THE 1<sup>ST</sup> OF SEPTEMBER 2023

Due to the Albanese governments implementation of 60 day dispensing there will be a 40% loss of funding to our pharmacy. Unfortunately, this means Stansbury Pharmacy will have to start charging for services we once did for free or a small cost. These fees will not recoup the losses but help keep the Pharmacy operational and retain staff.

Other follow-on effects of this ill-thought-out government policy include:

- Sponsorship and donations. For the last 14 years we have provided over \$5,000 per year supporting charities, local groups/organisations, and sporting clubs. Unfortunately, this will have to cease until a new PBS reform one day in the future hopefully.
- Opening hours and staffing. While we will try to maintain our current staffing and service there will be some changes in the future to help reduce costs.
- We will only open on Saturday mornings for markets. There may be the occasional day we are closed when George has an appointment, personal or family commitment or sick day for example. Where possible we will try to give advanced notice of course.
- When locums are working our hours may be reduced (9am to 2pm) each day, otherwise we would be running at a loss.

We are still hopeful that an 8<sup>th</sup> Pharmacy Agreement with the Government will rectify some of the funding for these services and the Pharmacy sector in general. But we will not know until this time comes as to when our customers, and most vulnerable of the community, will cease this extra financial burden.
