The Yorke Peninsula Council has recently commenced a review of their 2021-2025 Strategic Management Plan. This Plan is now nearing the end of its timeframe and it is important that it is reviewed and updated to reflect the expectations of the community, and provide guidance for growth and prosperity.

The Council has engaged Town Planning consultancy Holmes Dyer to undertake the review and prepare an updated Strategic Plan.

# RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

#### Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries. Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am-4pm.

#### **Blister Packs**

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.



## STANSBURY MUSEUM

# The Annual General Meeting of the Stansbury Museum will be held 9am September 20<sup>th</sup> at the Museum. All welcome

Two very unassuming but fascinating folders sit on one of the old school desks in the History Room at the Stansbury Museum. One is "School Diaries 1940 -42" and the other is "1940 -1942 Excerpts from the Pioneer". The Pioneer was the local area paper which was published in Yorketown from 1898 until 1954.

It is interesting to read these snippets and glimpses of life in Stansbury during early WW2. You glean an insight into how our small South Australian rural community was affected.

The children wrote in beautiful copper plate hand writing. They mention so many aspects of daily life in Stansbury at the time. One major topic was the current films being shown by Benbow's Pictures at the Institute for example, "Gunga Din", "Pygmalion", "Donald Duck and Pluto" and "Goodbye Mr Chips". Several circuses also came to town in 1940 and 1941 including Bullen Bros Circus and Goldwyns Circus. On May 23<sup>rd</sup> 1940 one of the children wrote "Sole Bros Circus visited the town and provided a 1<sup>st</sup> class show which was greatly enjoyed by a large audience".

Another topic was the weather and its effect on crops – they detailed the amount of rain, lack of rain and tanks becoming dry, fog, strong north winds and cold damp winds retarding harvesting. They listed the types of fish being caught and even that "a seal was an unusual visitor to the point". One of them recorded "ketches at the jetty loading local grain".

A huge variety of social events were mentioned that included "lantern slides showed at the Methodist Church in aid of Home Missions", sporting events (basketball and football), the Flower show, the Strawberry Fete and Dance, Empire Day, Arbor Day, fancy dress events, dances, 21<sup>st</sup> birthdays, a euchre tournament, a radio evening, a garden party and the Yorketown brass band playing on the foreshore.

Both the children and the journalists of the Pioneer mentioned aspects of the war and how it affected the community. They detailed locals going overseas with the AIF (Australian Imperial Force) and farewells that were held for these soldiers. They also noted that "owing to war conditions and the likelihood of petrol rationing the football season in 1940 was curtailed".

In 31<sup>st</sup> of May 1940, a "mobile recruiting van equipped with loud speakers toured the town and district seeking enlistments to the AIF". By mid 1941 the RAAF recruiting unit also visited the district to enlist men for the air force and a local committee was set up to deal with local volunteers. Later that year, the first soldier from Stansbury had paid the ultimate sacrifice and this was poignantly reported. By December 1941 many of the younger men in the district had been called up for duty in the militia in case of an attack being made on Australia by Japan. Later this was extended to married men between 35 and 45.

At home in Stansbury wartime restrictions came in. Brown out, light restrictions which meant there were no street lights, only the jetty light remained on and by March the following year no electric power was allowed during the day to help conserve crude oil stocks and night-time light restrictions increased with 2 wardens patrolling the town to detect any breach of the blackout regulations. Shops had to close at 6pm and ration books were distributed at the Institute in June 1942. There were state wide petrol restrictions so there were few holiday visitors over Christmas and New Year.

The diaries mentioned important war time efforts including the "Busy Bee" to dig a 150 foot (46 metre) slit trench for the children opposite the school, the burning of the partially demolished old jetty practising the "scorched earth policy" in case of Japanese invasion and plane spotting for aircraft from a specially erected platform on the Institute roof.

Community fund raising was a huge local focus to support the war effort. There was the "Popular Man contest, a Baby competition, a Trading Table, the Prisoner of War Appeal, the Patriotic Fund, Fancy Dress Ball and a Concert Party was held to aid Limbless Soldiers. The Stansbury Cheerio Club and the Stansbury Red Cross Circle aided by local school children collected and distributed donations of goods and money to those serving their country.

Both the school children's diaries and the newspaper paint a powerful picture of a proud patriotic community!

## STANSBURY CFS - NEEDS YOUR HELP!!

Stansbury CFS has been active in the Stansbury community for more than 70 years (1952), but we desperately need new members. I'm scared that if numbers continue to fall and we are unable to respond – the Government might close the brigade.

This is your service, it is people in our community – serving our community, if you don't do it, there is no one else. For example – there is one paid paramedic on the YP

If there is chance that you, your family members, or significant others in your life, may need emergency services in the future and you don't want them suffering unnecessarily, please consider joining the CFS.

In keeping with the rhythms of life - we have had a few resignations (health related and moving away from the area) and along with new ways of working – several of our members are now away from Stansbury for extended periods with work contracts. This means that Stansbury CFS is critically low on Members (particularly drivers – HR). We are at real risk of not being able to respond to emergencies and if this happens too many times – we risk losing our brigade.

Being regional and remote – the CFS is often the first responder to any number of emergency incidents in our region. Along with our traditional role in wildfires, CFS also is responsible for structure fires (house and industrial fires – e.g. Klein Point Quarry and Silos at Port Giles) and is often the first arriving service at Road Crash Incidents – (assist SAPOL). Other emergency incidents (such as Hazardous material, chemical spills, floods, trees down, powerlines down), and increasingly we aid the South Australian Ambulance Service (SAAS), both for patient lifts, drive ambulance and now medical incidents as traditional agencies are stretched further and further.

We need between 20 and 25 active members, to spread the load and to ensure that we can get a crew to any call out.

The commitment of time is not onerous. No one expects you to put your life on hold, if you have had a few drinks, or are throwing a surprise party for someone, or are at work and cannot reasonably get away, don't turn up to a call out – we understand.

You don't have to show up to every training session (it's nice if you do). To remain active, you must attend and complete an annual "Skills Maintenance Drill" (demonstrate your physical ability to get in and out of the truck - and awareness of your own safety) and turn up to training (which is often just a catch up and a drink) say 4 times per year.

Age or Gender should not deter you from making a contribution. Our current membership includes 2 females. Our oldest active member is around 75 and our youngest is 30.
