## RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

**Nespresso pods:** Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.



**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.  
*No hypodermic needles please.*

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

### **Yellow Bin**

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.

### **Blister Packs**

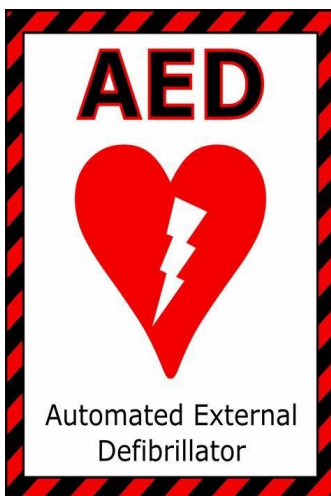
Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

### **Battery Recycling**

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

## STANSBURY MUSEUM

We would like to thank all of those who joined us to celebrate 50 years of the fabulous Stansbury Museum. It was gratifying to have a mix of locals, visiting families, regular caravan park patrons and volunteers who enjoyed the celebration. John Elliott, our longest currently serving volunteer, (a remarkable 35 years) was on hand to cut the cake. A big Thank You! to Rob Tonkin for providing musical entertainment all afternoon. Thank you also to Ron and Chris Duncan for donating the delicious birthday cake and Jo Minks for her baking. Thanks also need to go to Carrol Roberts for her huge personal contribution and leading our amazing team of volunteers that ensured the success of this event.

At our celebration, I was talking to the grand daughter of William Donovan who was the local bootmaker and repairer in Stansbury from about 1945 until his retirement in 1965 in his 80's. Before coming to Stansbury, William Donovan had an interesting life. At 13 years old he travelled from SA to the WA goldfields and began prospecting. He shared ownership of several different mines out of Marvel Loch and Southern Cross, WA. The most notable of these mines he named "Donovan's Find". It is still named that. Although it was profitable, it really hit pay dirt after he sold it to a Perth Company in 1908. He returned to South Australia and he eventually returned to the trade of boot making and repairing.

A selection of his tools and lasts are displayed in the Museum's large shed. The metal and wooden lasts are shoemaker's models used when shaping and repairing shoes and boots. There are clever tools for working the leather – for cutting and shaping, for stretching, for making holes for laces, for removing tacks, stitching, hammering and gripping. There is also a shoe polishing kit for preserving and polishing. Some of his grand daughter's enduring memories are of her grandfather tapping away as he hammered in very small sharp tacks and the large lethal looking needles that were threaded with coarse thread that had been waxed to make it more durable.

I was interested that an older gentleman who shared our conversation, and who played as a lad, remembered that "Pop Donovan" individually crafted the pyramid shaped leather sprigs for the footy boots of the Stansbury Football Club players. A labour of love considering that each boot would have had 8 or 9 sprigs, each player had 2 boots and there would have been at least 18 players per team! He was even known to replace damaged sprigs during matches. In today's modern world most of us purchase off the shelf, factory made shoes and rarely do we get them repaired. So different from William Donovan's day, when with meticulous, exacting skills and pride in his job his grand daughter said "He saved many soles".

We have many different shoes on display at the museum. There are some very old leather footy boots amongst our extensive display of sporting paraphernalia relating to sports played in Stansbury over the years.

Classic boots on display are those worn by a local lime burner. No doubt you have heard the saying "as dry as a lime burner's boot". This Aussie saying means you are very thirsty and desperate for a drink or that something is extremely dry. Lime burners worked in hot, dusty, dry conditions. Boots worn in that environment became incredibly dry and cracked. This pair of boots is a classic example of the desiccating effect of the lime burner's work environment.

There are many examples of shoes that in their day were the height of fashion. There is a little pair of black patent leather girls' shoes. They were very popular in their day as special occasion shoes. I always wanted a pair as a little girl. Interestingly, there was a caution at the time in some circles that the shiny surface was reflective and could show the wearer's underwear. I honestly don't remember if my parents subscribed to that notion, but I never did get the longed for black patent shoes.

The children's clothing display also has some soft blue leather shoes with the strap secured with a button. They would have been worn by a toddler. There is a child's pair of white, buckled leather shoes with a punched out decorative pattern and an extremely old and worn pair of brown, roman style sandals. We have several pairs of shoes displayed with the dresses that they were worn with so that visitors can get a complete picture of the fashions of the day. My particular favourite is a stunning pair of ladies shoes which are multicoloured, daisy patterned brocade with gold leather strapping in 1920's T bar style. The strap provided stability for dancing. Can you imagine a young woman in her flapper style beaded dress and silk stockings wearing these whilst doing the Charleston (a popular dance in the 1920's).

The Stansbury Museum is full of items that can vividly conjure up images in your mind of days gone by and will tell you fascinating stories about the town and surrounding area and the people who lived here.

It was after the Edithburgh fire that I first spoke to the Stansbury CFS captain to see if there was a role I could play at the local brigade. He immediately signed me up for the next training, and I've ridden on the truck ever since. I may not be the fastest or strongest on the fire ground, but it's not always about speed and strength. Sometimes I'm holding a traffic sign, sometimes I'm giving directions, sometimes I'm helping SAAS with a patient.

Right now my family and work commitments demand a lot of my time, but I've never felt pressured to attend every incident. As volunteers we are encouraged to take care of our own welfare and mental health. I attend as many incidents as I can and play whatever part I am able to when there. I also try to assist with any community engagement activities, and helping Santa on Christmas Eve is a highlight.

Our family farm is close to town, and the CFS are often called to accidents, trees down, and occasionally fires in that area. To date we've been fortunate, but if ever my family or the farm is involved I want to know that help can come from Stansbury, just 6 minutes away. I hope this will continue to be possible for many years to come.
