RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda. *No hypodermic needles please.*

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries. Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.

Blister Packs

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

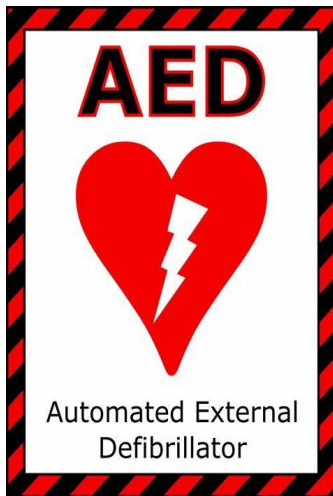

MOBILITY SCOOTERS

It appears as though there has been confusion lately about the use of mobility scooters, the road rules around them and road safety.

A mobility scooter is a motorised wheelchair, not capable of travelling at a speed of over 10 km/h.

Mobility scooters are to use a footpath or nature strip where one is available. You must keep to the far left or far right of a road where there is no footpath or nature strip, or it is not practical to use them.

A mobility scooter is not to cause a traffic hazard or obstruction.

A mobility scooter is only to be ridden by one person, and the mass on the scooter must not exceed 250 kilograms.
