Jodi Lee Foundation Trek SA 2022 - Report from Kevin Forrest

The Jodi Lee Foundation Trek SA was held on Yorke Peninsula on 13 and 14 May, with trekkers walking a total of 38.5kms from Rogues Point to Port Vincent on Friday 13 May.

On Saturday 14 May, the Trek commenced at Port Moorowie and ended at Edithburgh. Kevin joined the Trek at Kemp Bay and walked the 26km to Edithburgh, arriving there about 5 hours later.

There were 176 entries for the event, although a few were forced to drop out because of Covid restrictions. One section of 4km was quite difficult due to the height of the tide forcing people up onto the softer sand and seaweed.

It was a successful event, raising over \$139,000 which will be used to run a Community Grants program in August. This program will allow Australians across the country to apply for grants to support their local bowel cancer awareness events. RECYCLING:

To help keep our town beautiful, and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full please leave the paper bundles under the verandah.

Soft plastics: These can also be placed in the cube if they are <u>clean and appropriately packed</u>. Please package the clean plastics into another bag or container for placement into the cube.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located</u> <u>around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling have a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

The Visitor Centre is also able to receive little plastic bread bag sealers, aluminium can pull tabs and used biros – no ink. However, we are **no longer able to accept plastic screw lids, Colgate products or blister packs.**

EMERGENCY DEFIBRILLATORS:

In the event of cardiac arrest emergency defibrillators are situated at the following locations:

- Foreshore Caravan Park on the outside wall of the office to the left of the door.
- Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, on the outside of the small red brick building adjacent to the entrance of the park.
- Stansbury Pharmacy on the outside, eastern wall.
- Stansbury Bowling Club on the club house wall facing the greens.
- Stansbury Golf Club on the front veranda of the club rooms.

These are automated and instructions are provided so please don't be afraid to use one. You could save a life!

We met at a Barn Dance out at Parson's farm.


Did you play sport when you were younger?

Projects – Following the resurfacing of the Stansbury Courts, we have now installed the coaches boxes. These have been a great addition to the courts and look very smart. We were successful in obtaining funding through the AGL Wattle Point Wind Farm Community Fund for \$1,000 to purchase an automatic coffee machine. Coffee will now be available to purchase at our events. We thank AGL for the grant funding and look forward to serving up some freshly brewed coffee soon.

We have also been successful in receiving an additional \$5,000 of funding from AGL to assist with Refreshing the Community & Spectator Area at the Courts. This will compliment the newly surfaced courts and recently built coaches boxes.

STANSBURY MUSEUM

Stansbury Museum has an extensive collection of dolls and toys

Today, we know dolls as playthings for children. In some societies, dolls have also had significant roles in religious, cultural and magic practices. The oldest known dolls are ancient Egyptian wooden paddle dolls which were found in tombs –they are thought to have religious significance and were possibly used in ceremonies prior to entombment.

The earliest known toy dolls have been found in graves of children from Ancient Rome and stories from Ancient Greece mention dolls being played with by little girls.

Dolls tend to be made out of materials available locally – for example traditional Inuit dolls were made from soapstone or bone and dressed in animal furs and skins and poor people as early as the 16th century used wooden clothes pegs to make their dolls.

Story telling can be enhanced using dolls and historically dolls have been used to tell stories like the Nativity. For centuries, children have used dolls to tell the stories of their imagination. The museum has a very clever doll that tells the story of little Red Riding Hood. It incorporates Red Riding Hood, her Grandmother and the wolf all in one doll. There are also the Seven Dwarf dolls and seven dolls that illustrate the nursery rhyme "Monday's child is fair of face".

Costumed dolls depict their country of origin. There are dolls in the museum from Greece India, China, Mexico, Japan, Red Indian, Inuit, Pacific Islands, Russia, Wales, the Netherlands, New Zealand and New Guinea.

There are numerous types and styles of dolls displayed including baby dolls, rag dolls, Barbies, collectible licensed dolls eg Disney and Humphrey B Bear, peg dolls, Kewpies, clowns, gollywogs, teddy bears and corn dollies. Some of the dolls are beautifully displayed in wicker prams, push chairs, cradles and even a miniature bouncinette.

Examples of toys displayed are hand fashioned wooden guns, farm equipment and a carved wooden horse, an old tin top, a tiny tin motor cycle and rider, a wind up tin train engine, marbles, plastic cowboys and Indians, dinky cars, a children's paint box, knuckle bones, board games and a tea set.
