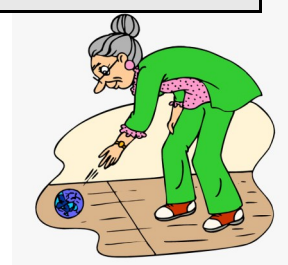

RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.



Blister Packs

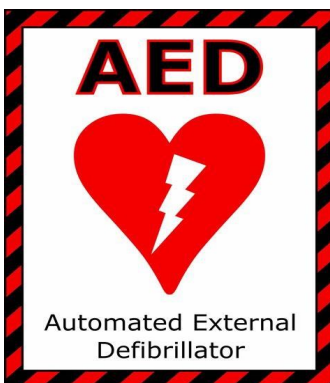
Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

REMINDER



It is state legislation that anyone responsible for the control of a dog in a public space must immediately remove any faeces deposited and dispose of it in a lawful manner. If not picked up immediately there is a possible \$210 fine

It is a council by-law that persons with control of a dog carry a bag or suitable container for collection and disposal of dog faeces. None compliance has a possible fine of \$312.50.

There are bags available around the town. Please use them and not leave your pet's deposits behind.

You are responsible for the control of your dog, so that means it should not be roaming without supervision.

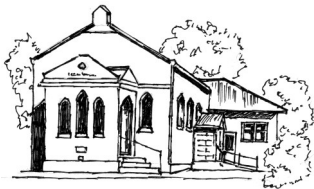

STANSBURY MUSEUM

South Australia's History Festival 2025 runs throughout May. This year's theme was "Decisions". Our state's history has been shaped by "decisions" made on many levels by many groups and individuals in both formal and informal settings. Decisions, both minor and major have been made in parliaments, councils, schools, workplaces, at committee meetings, over a beer at the pub, around the dinner table or campfire. These decisions all shape our history.

An example of one of these "decisions" was one made locally by Stansbury residents, Mr Merv and Mrs Rachel Choat. They decided to donate their huge and comprehensive shell collection to the Stansbury Museum on condition the collection be kept intact and on display for all to enjoy. It is a collection of such quality that they could have easily made the decision to donate it to a much larger and more prestigious museum. It is a truly impressive display of shells and associated documentation passionately collected from all over the world. Coincidentally, I discovered that this year's History Week in New South Wales is themed "Water Stories" and this ties in nicely with the shell collection which holds so many individual stories. I'd like to share one fascinating "water story" about the beautiful paper nautilus shell. The museum has many for everyone to see, thanks to the generous "decision" made by Mr and Mrs Choat.

The Paper Nautilus

I bet not many people know that one rough and stormy winter this delicate and beautiful shell caused quite a frenzy on Yorke Peninsula beaches with people searching for these rare specimens. It takes extremely rough seas disturbing the water to blow these shells up onto the beach. These shells are actually an egg incubator for an octopus called the paper nautilus (argonauta.spp). They live in the water column quite unlike other octopuses that are sea floor dwellers. The female creates the paper like shell by secreting a form of calcium. She lays the eggs inside and then squeezes into the shell herself, mostly with her head and tentacles outside but if threatened retreating right inside. Amazingly these shells also act as a floatation device when a bubble of air is trapped inside. The paper nautilus can then bob about in the water column. They have even been found on drift wood or catching a ride on jelly fish. For speedier movement on their own, they use jet propulsion by squirting out water. Another amazing fact is the massive discrepancy in size and weight between the sexes of these unusual octopuses. Males are less than 2.5cm long and females are 37cm or longer. Females are 600 times heavier than males.

Who knew that Stansbury Museum had such fascinating natural history items! There are many more "water stories" relating to the shell collection but also to the history of fishing in Oyster Bay, Stansbury and boating and shipping in the seas around Yorke Peninsula. The show piece of the museum's front yard, our windmill, tells another "water story" as does our display of kettles and electric jugs.

The Stansbury Museum holds and tells so many stories of decisions made and the consequences of these decisions. All museums showcase lessons of the past and from these future decisions can be shaped.

Recently Stansbury Museum volunteers have been privileged to assist several visitors to access and add significant information to their understanding of their ancestors' lives in and around the Stansbury area. Stansbury community members, past and present have generously given information and items to add to the museum's collection and it is wonderful to share these with visitors and help them build pictures of their relatives and the lives they lived. Many of these visitors (some from interstate) are blown away that a museum in such a small country town has such comprehensive information and records. We should all be very proud of our museum!

Like Stansbury itself, the museum punches above its weight. It may seem like a male paper nautilus but performs more like a female paper nautilus!
