RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.



Blister Packs

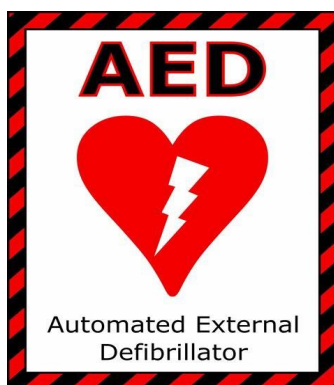
Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

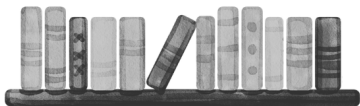

STANSBURY MUSEUM

As you may be aware, the Museum was closed for a short time in August. This is traditionally one of our quietest months for visitors so we took the opportunity to get most of the rooms in the main building painted. This involved a mammoth effort, many hours and considerable expertise and skill by Greg. He was ably supported by a team of volunteers (Paul, Lawrie, Mark, Jodie, Craig and Carrol).

I know I speak on behalf of the Museum committee when I extend our grateful thanks to all of them for their hard work. Believe me, some of it was extremely physical and difficult! Just to prepare the rooms for painting involved removal of many items and dismantling of many displays. As many of the items are delicate, rare and irreplaceable this was exacting work and once the painting was completed everything had to be put back again.

The results of our volunteers' hard work is a fresher, brighter environment. It illustrates our on-going commitment to maintaining the Museum as a valuable community asset.

Thank you again to all the volunteers who put in such a sterling effort with a fabulous result!

I recently read an interesting article in a Scottish magazine called the People's Friend .The article was called "Spring Cleaning with the National Trust". The National Trust in the UK aims to preserve natural and historical heritage and to allow access to these places for everyone to enjoy. Amongst the many ways they do this is to conserve many historical buildings and the treasures they hold, in much the same way that the volunteers of the Stansbury Museum maintain the building and the exhibits within.

Spring cleaning is a practice that originated in Europe many hundreds of years ago. When Spring arrived following cold, dark winters, people were able to open up their homes and let in sunshine and fresh air and rid themselves of the dust and grime that had built up over winter.

National Trust properties spring clean in Spring, preparing for summer when they have the majority of their visitors. Stansbury Museum also does this, as summer is our prime time for visitors. We have a maintenance programme throughout the year but in rotation do thorough spring clean of each area. It is not only cleaning, it is protecting our exhibits from pests like mice and insects.

According to the article I read, a stately home in Derbyshire has a room that is called "the room of destruction" and has displays showing the damage that can be caused by pests and environmental factors like dampness and too much daylight. They have examples of a wooden casket damaged by woodworm, books ruined by silverfish and fabrics with holes eaten by the larvae of moths.

We recently had an example of environmental damage caused by a leaking roof which unfortunately dripped through to a display of books. One of these was badly damaged. Quick thinking by volunteers saved the rest and a speedy repair of the roof had to be done. The Museum was very pleased to be able to find another copy of the book at a second hand book seller that was signed by the author just the same as the original. A generous Stansbury local met the cost of replacement –Thank you Ted!

Even cleaning too frequently can cause damage. In National Trust properties tapestries are vacuumed only once in a decade and paintings are only cleaned on a 25 yearly basis by specially trained conservators. Even fibres from peoples clothing can cause damage. An interesting fact was that during the COVID pandemic, when National Trust buildings were closed for long periods, that the number of pests increased. Being closed up and unused was not good for the buildings and their collections of treasures. Pests and mould apparently thrive in environments that are quiet, dark and still. When visitors walk through these buildings, and indeed our Museum, they help aid airflow and ventilation. Sometimes at the Museum, Stansbury's winds bring dust and frankly too much airflow, so our front door needs to be partially closed even when we are open but don't let that stop you from entering, we are only protecting our exhibits and maintaining the building.

Did you know that the South Australian Government has an agency named Artlab Australia which has since 1985 been a nationally and internationally recognised leader in the conservation of cultural collections? They provide expert services for the preservation, care and management of the state's cultural collections. As well as working with major institutions like the South Australian Museum and the Art Gallery of SA, they can provide support to collections in community hands like our museum.
