RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.



Blister Packs

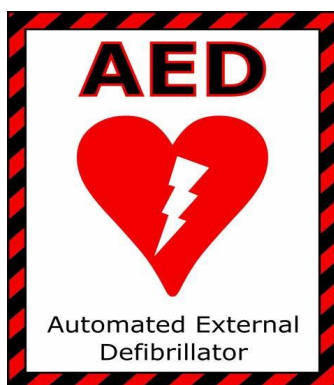
Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

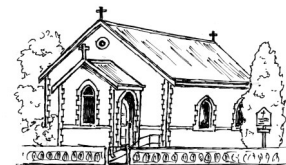

STANSBURY MUSEUM

My inspiration for this month's article came when I visited the Royal Australian Mint in Canberra recently. As most of us know, the mint is where our nation's coins are produced. They mint coins used as everyday currency and also collectible coins and medals. Founded in 1965, the Royal Australian Mint, Canberra was established with new coin presses to meet the demand for newly minted coins when Australia changed to the decimal system. Prior to 1965, coins were produced at the Melbourne Mint. It was still using a coin press that was built around 1863. The new coin presses produced coins at almost 6 times the rate of the old press. The Melbourne Mint still operates but is now in private ownership.

The Royal Australian Mint is not merely a factory making coins. It considers itself a custodian of Australian stories making collectible coins that commemorate special events, organisations and people. One of its displays says "We make coins that reflect our history, our achievements, our journey and our people" The Mint also incorporates a museum with dedicated curatorial staff. It showcases historical and rare coins.

It currently has an exhibition called "Reflection 50 years of the Australian Honours System". Did you know the Mint also produces the medals that are presented to those who are acknowledged by the Australian honours and awards system? The recipients are Australians who have distinguished themselves by exceptional achievement, service or bravery. The mint has been producing these medals for 50 years since 1975 when the Australian honours and award system replaced the imperial system of British honours.

Two members of the current Stansbury Museum committee have been recipients of the Order of Australia Medal. In 2004 Ray Agnew was honoured for his service to local government and to the community of Yorke Peninsula and in 2021 Ron Duncan was honoured for his service to the community of Stansbury. Both of them have shown outstanding and continuing service over many years and their recognition was well deserved!

The museum has an interesting set of medals which were also received by a Stansbury resident, not for service but for excellent produce. Louis Frederick Wurm was a Prussian immigrant to South Australia in 1854. After a stint in the mounted of police, he settled for a time in Unley. In 1874 he moved to Stansbury and pioneered olive growing in the area. His 80 acre olive grove was situated alongside the cliffs about 2 kilometres north of Stansbury and produced high quality olive oil. Not content with this he also made wine, dried fruit, was a wheat agent and even made silk (no doubt, his silk worms were fed from the leaves of the mulberry trees he grew). He was also partner in a general store at Stansbury which had branches at Curramulka and Minlaton.

Fred Wurm (as he was often known) must have been a very enterprising man with vision. In 1876 he won a large bronze medal at the International Exhibition of Arts, Manufactures and Products of the Soil and Mine in Philadelphia, U.S.A. It was also known as the Centennial Exhibition, the first world's fair held in the United States. Coinciding with the 100th anniversary of the Declaration of Independence it was a really big deal and attracted about 10 million visitors. When you think of it, it was a significant achievement that an olive oil produced in South Australia was judged as world class. Not satisfied with this, in 1887 Fred also won awards at the Adelaide Jubilee International Exhibition exhibiting his produce on a stand made of native timber. The large medals (75mm diameter) awarded for this produce had the regal head of Queen Victoria on one side and on the other has a wreath of Australian native flowers, fruits and vegetables with First Order of Merit in the centre. These medals were made at the Royal Mint in Melbourne. The reason Queen Victoria's head was displayed on the medals was that the Adelaide Jubilee International Exhibition was a celebration of the 50th year of Queen Victoria's accession to the throne. It was also a celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the proclamation of the Proclamation of South Australia.

This was a very significant event in South Australia. There were incredibly formal and auspicious opening and closing ceremonies with addresses by dignitaries, prayers and music. The music included “the Exhibition Cantata”, “the Jubilee Cantata”, “The Song of Australia and “God Save The Queen” which were sung by a choir accompanied by an orchestra. Interestingly the number of people who attended this exhibition was almost twice the population of Adelaide at that time (1887).



Come and look at the medals and reflect on the hard work and courage of this immigrant from Dortmund in Prussia (now Germany) who became a pioneer of Stansbury and achieved South Australian and world wide success. He and his descendants contributed to the Stansbury over generations in their new homeland.

Stansbury Museum showcases stories and items that like the mint's coins “reflect our history, our achievements, our journey and our people”.

CHI KUNG (QI GONG)

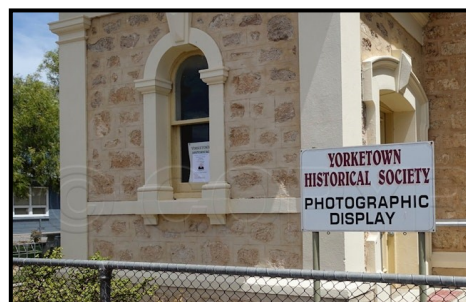
