RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.



Blister Packs

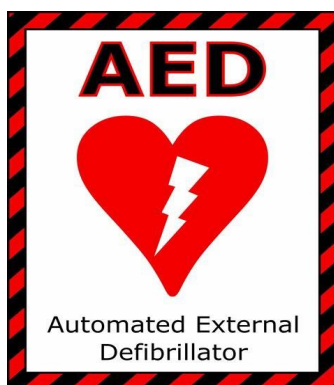
Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

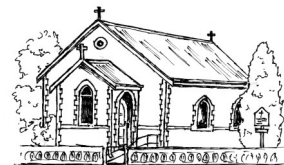

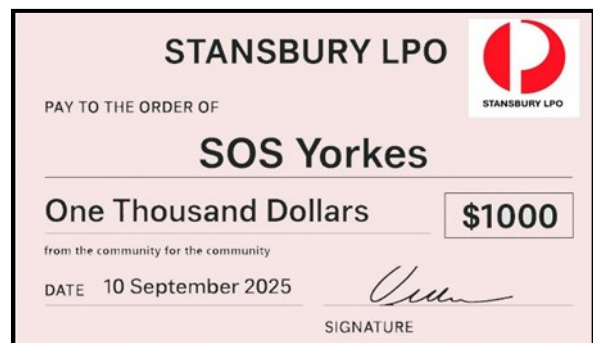
Thank you to everyone who joined me on the Walk to Stamp Out Suicide and to those who supported from afar. Your presence and kindness mean so much.

For our September outing 21 people visited Ducatoon Park Horse Breeders at Boors Plains, 6 kilometres from Kadina. We were greeted by Peter Toole and wife, Valmai. Peter spoke on the breeding of race horses and the processes until the foal is born.

It was interesting to know that when a foal is due they attach a harness to the horse that alerts them to an imminent birth. An alarm goes through to the house when the horse lays down. A few days after birth the trainers start to handle them so they are used to people. There are a lot of legal regulations to register the foal and it is usually 2 to 3 years of hard work before they start to race. We were very lucky to see a mare with a pure black filly just a couple of weeks old.

As a hobby Peter creates scroll saw models and we spent time looking at his many projects, including a 4 foot high Eiffel Tower, plus others all which would have taken hours.

We all enjoyed lunch at the Port Hughes Tavern and it was great to see Jeanette Hanrahan, originally from Stansbury and catch up on her news.

Towards the end of August, we held our Annual General Meeting. We have had a few small changes. Our committee lost one long serving volunteer, Leonie Wilson who made a significant contribution to the museum in many ways. We are pleased to welcome Wendy Rushbrook to the committee. As a final year student of the Master of Curatorial and Museum Studies at the University of Adelaide and also a teacher, Wendy brings unique skills and knowledge to our team.

We look forward to seeing lots of visitors to the museum as the weather warms and as the South Australian community supports Yorke Peninsula, despite the challenges of the algal bloom. As usual, we will have our stall at the market on the October long weekend and look forward to seeing you there. Our egg 'n bacon sandwiches are the perfect way to start your day and sausages and onion in bread topped with sauce of your choice hit the spot any time of the day.

I recently spent some time in Coolangatta, the southern most area of Queensland's Gold Coast. Having been to the Gold Coast several times before, it was interesting for me to note changes. As I relaxed in the sun and enjoyed the beautiful coastline, I wondered about the history of the area. How did it come to be what it is today?

The original indigenous inhabitants were the Kombumerri clan of the Yugamben nation which includes South East Queensland and North Eastern New South Wales. They were the custodians of the coastal and inland regions from the Coomera River to the Tweed River. They lived off the land and fished the rivers and the ocean European settlement began in earnest in the mid to late 1800s. The red cedar trees of the hinterland forests were in high demand especially for ship building. Farming was the main industry alongside the timber industry. By 1925 there was a railway and paved road from Brisbane and this really opened up the area. This same year the Surfers Paradise was built and the tourism boom began. Initially it was mostly holiday makers from Brisbane who visited. Following World War 2, the area became popular with returned servicemen. By the end of the 1940's it became known as "the Gold Coast", a name coined by journalists and real estate speculators who no doubt profited from the tourism boom. Development continued as low rise hotels, boarding houses and suburban homes until the 1960's when high rise apartments became the trend and since then they have risen steadily upwards resulting in the iconic skyline we see today.

Black and white photos in many businesses in Coolangatta document these historical changes. Where there are now massive steel, glass and concrete towers that house holiday makers today, in the 1930's to 50's there were less imposing wooden Queenslander style guest houses. Today the Gold Coast is the sixth biggest city in Australia having been transformed, since the early years of the timber industry and farming, to a tourist destination for visitors from all over Australia and the world.

At Stansbury Museum, you can see how Stansbury came to be what it is today. There are photos that show how the streetscapes have changed over the years. You can see how farming and fishing practices have changed. You can see how the fashions worn by Stansbury residents have changed. Looking at black and white photos of school classes in the history room you can see how the clothing children and teachers wore to school has changed and also how class sizes differ.

There are so many different ways that the museum tells the story of how Stansbury came to be what it is today ...physical exhibits to see and some to touch, photos, drawings, paintings, words and books. However you like to learn and experience the world, there is something for you at Stansbury Museumcome and see for yourself, bring friends and family to experience what our great Museum has to offer. Visitors are frequently amazed at the amount that is packed into this hidden gem and Stansbury treasure. We are proud to share it with locals and visitors alike.
