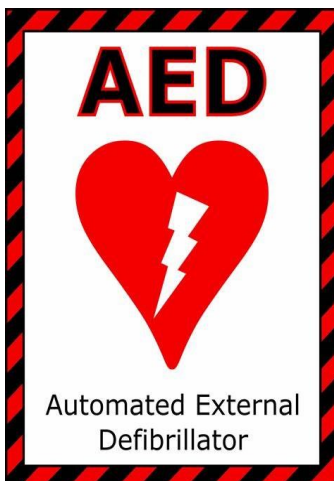

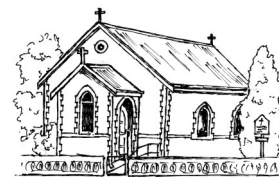

There are many small and medium sized museums through our state and the country that focus on their unique areas. Many travellers love to get a feel for an area by visiting the local museum. Amongst our recent visitors have been visitors from Canada and China. There have been interstate visitors from Canberra (ACT), Thirroul (east coast of NSW) and Mortdale (southern Sydney). We also had many visitors from SA and locally from Yorke Peninsula. No matter how close you live or how far away, there is something of interest for you to see at the Stansbury Museum.

I recently travelled to Mannum on the River Murray. Whilst there, I visited the Mannum Dock Discovery Centre which houses both the Mannum Visitor Information Centre and the Museum. It's a great place to call in and look around. This museum showcases river and river boat history, local aboriginal cultural history and geology.

Like our museum, there are outdoor displays – the Randall Dry Dock, the Steam Shed, a working blacksmiths shop and the river vessels, the PS Marion and the PW Mayflower. The Randall Dry Dock is significant as it is the only place on the River Murray where you can still see a dry dock of this type which was used for repairing paddle steamers and barges. It was first used in 1876. The museum's primary workforce is volunteers although unlike ours they also have a paid staff member as well.

Volunteers are the lifeblood of country museums and are a great way to connect with your community. If you think that might like to join our team of volunteers, we'd love to hear from you – just ring Carrol 0409 094 009 or Rowena 0407188 689. Everyone can contribute in some way.

Another interesting, historical find on my trip was in, of all places, the ladies loos near the Gawler Visitors Information Centre. I was amazed to see on the back of the toilet doors in the "advertising space", information about historical events and people of note in the Gawler area. One called "Horses for Courses" talked about the "long standing and proud association with horses that Gawler has and has had" – the Gawler Jockey Club (1891 – present), the Gawler harness racing (1910 – 2008, 2018 — present) and the Gawler Three Day Event (1959-1996). As early as March 1856, the Gawler Town Races were held. "Horses for Courses" also mentions an amusing situation a lady judge had when she went to the mobile toilet (called a honey wagon) at one jump. By the time she emerged, it had been moved to another jump because another judge at a different jump had need of the loo. Needless to say she was a bit perplexed as to her whereabouts.

Another cubicle door had stories about two Gawler identities of the past - Mr Martin, who built locomotives and Mr McKinlay who led an expedition in search of Burke and Wills. You just never know where you will learn about the history of our state!

The Stansbury Museum building, its displays and its volunteers contribute to the education and enjoyment of many travellers to our town. It is a tourism asset. The museum committee and volunteers appreciate all the community support we receive in so many ways – thank you again.
