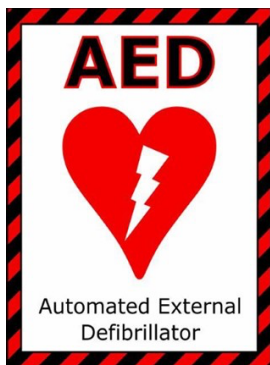

## STANSBURY COMMUNITY CRAFT & FRIENDSHIP

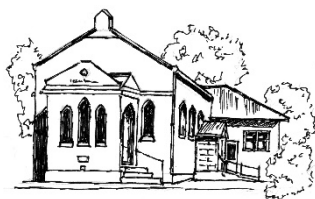

## IN-BETWEENS / TAI CHI GROUP

Our group hosted an information session on the 21<sup>st</sup> of May and Lachlan Cole from Rex Minerals Hillside Mine at Ardrossan was the speaker. He showed us a short video of the planned mine site and spoke on the history of Rex Minerals, the mineral deposits, and the expected final copper output and expected operating years. There was information regarding the road changes, actual mine excavation area, the inclusion of a processing plant, the access to the service supply of water and power.

Due to the destruction of the native vegetation, there will be a huge project to replant over a larger area with more plants. There were a wide variety of questions, including how the mine personnel would interact with the local population, businesses, schooling and additional medical facilities. The hope is that families will live locally rather than on a fly in- fly out basis. The setting up process alone will require 400 people and may take up to two years to complete, with opportunities for more varied permanent positions once operations start. Most people were happy to have some of their concerns answered and generally pleased with the outcome of the session. Many of the Group enjoyed lunch at the Blue Lime Café.

The Group has received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Royal Flying Doctor Service for the donation we forwarded to them following our annual general meeting.

The next planned outing for the Group will be a tour of the Salt Works at Price on the 16<sup>th</sup> of July, followed by lunch at the Wheatsheaf Hotel at Price. More details will be in the July edition of the Stansbury Scribble.

## STANSBURY MUSEUM

My first pleasure this month is to thank the many volunteers who contributed to our market stall being successful this market season. Your massive effort is so appreciated. It has been a great contribution. Each museum market stall takes around 20 volunteers who between them contribute more than 70 volunteer hours. Some volunteers are very visible on the day and others in the background quietly beaver away, before and after the event.

**Thank you and well done everyone!**

A recent donation to the museum of a vintage wicker dolls pram and discussion of where it should be displayed made me want to tell you of another one of our collections and some associated items. The museum has a toy collection, a doll collection and also a baby pram and pusher collection. This recently acquired dolls pram has a wooden base with lino covering with wicker sides. It has a fixed wicker hood with a fancy looped wicker edging. For anyone unfamiliar with the term wicker, it is the method of weaving pliable materials, both natural (cane, rattan, willow) or synthetic (eg polyethylene rattan). The suspension, wheels and stylishly curved side bars are made of metal bridged with a turned wooden handle. The beautiful white, woollen blanket with a cute little dogs head in the centre that completes this item was actually the donor's pram blanket. This dolls pram is in very good condition considering its age. It was the pride and joy of the donor's mother, Vanessa who was born in 1907 and has obviously been treasured. It is interesting that in the early to mid 1900's when this style of doll's pram was popular they were often sold by charities supporting blind or vision impaired people who did wicker work as an occupational therapy or vocational training. In South Australia, the Institute for the Blind was established in 1884 in North Adelaide and went on to become the Royal Society for the Blind in 1903 that eventually relocated to Gilles Plains.

The museum also has examples of the full sized baby prams on which these dolls prams were modelled. They have wicker work hoods that have wing nuts to allow the hood position to be altered and have cloth covered interiors. Later models had plastic covered interiors.

Did you know that prams used to be known as perambulators? This comes from the Latin word ambulare (to walk) because you were walking your baby around. Later it was shortened to pram. One of the museum's other dolls prams is a classic Cyclops model. It has a red pressed tin body with a motif in blue on each side of the body. It has a blue cloth hood which folds down. It has a metal handle, wheels and suspension. The wheels have white rubber embedded in the metal. Cyclops made dolls prams in Australia from the 1910's to the 1970's. The one at the museum is an earlier model, probably made between 1920 and 1940.

The museum also has a very special child's pusher/pull along. It has a wicker work seat and curved wicker backrest and a wooden T bar handle that was used to either push or pull it along with child on board. It has metal wheels with solid black rubber inserts. What makes it so special is that we have a photo of the first child to use this pusher. It shows Betty Halliday, as a baby/ toddler with a white sun hat and dress. You can see that she has leather shoes on her dangling feet (there is no foot rest on this model). In the photo, you can see an adult male who is holding the handle of the pusher. When trying to find out more about Betty, I found in the Birthdays column of Advertiser newspaper of Tuesday June 20<sup>th</sup> 1944 that Betty Halliday, Stansbury was listed but no mention of her age at this time. If it was marking her 21<sup>st</sup> birthday, this would date the photo to around 1924. This assumption ties in with the Roll Book for the Methodist Sunday School 1917-1931 showing young Betty Halliday as a regular attendee from 1929 to March 1936, presumably during her primary school years.

Whilst it is important for museums to record events and occasions of note, their remit to record and show the daily lives of the community is, to my mind, their most important purpose. I love to imagine the foot steps of the children in their school room (now our museum), the little girls playing with their dolls and dolls prams, their mothers proudly showing off their babies in wicker prams and their father or older brother with their precious little one sitting in a brand new pusher going for a walk. The objects in the museum all tell a story about the people of days gone by, both in their home and work lives. They also tell how local and world events impacted the local community. Museums are fascinating places!
