

RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am-4pm.

Blister Packs

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

STANSBURY MUSEUM

In February, the Stansbury Museum committee were very pleased to host an early evening museum opening for the Stansbury Progress Association Committee and its employees. We were especially delighted to have the opportunity to showcase the museum to staff of the Visitors Information Centre. In their day to day contact with visitors to Stansbury, they are great ambassadors for the museum. The Stansbury Progress Association has, over many years, and in many ways, supported the Museum. We appreciate that and wanted to thank them. The Stansbury Museum is a very important town asset.

In March, as well as our Seaside Market Stall, we held a "Thank you morning tea" for our volunteers. I want to share with you, our Chairman, Carrol's welcome. I felt she covered so well all the different areas of volunteering at the museum. I have added some comments of my own in italics.

"Good Morning and Welcome to all! This is our first morning tea since COVID and is long overdue. This is our time to say "Thank you" to all our volunteers for the many different ways that they contribute to the museum. Time, as you are all aware, is a valuable commodity. That you are personally willing to share yours is very much appreciated.

The Seaside Markets, our major fundraiser, needs the most volunteers performing many different roles. Each role is as important as the other and together makes a good team. Without your help it would not be possible to keep the museum financially viable especially with rising costs. Other fundraising efforts include catering for the RSL ANZAC breakfast and our recent raffle.

We are lucky to have our talented male volunteers who always work on improving our outside areas and exhibits with occasional help from the Tidy Towns group and others. The Museum is kept in excellent condition inside and out. One of the most written comments is how clean and well maintained the museum and surrounds are kept. This is the result of the time and effort of many volunteers. We would not be able to receive visitors twice weekly at normal opening times, daily in January and for special events if we did not have people who regularly volunteer on our rosters. We appreciate your willingness to swap or help out at any time.

With any museum, there is never ending data entering, scanning photos, labelling, sorting and many aspects of recording and archiving new donations. After being entered on our data base and photographed, each item needs to be displayed appropriately. It also needs to be presented in the best way so it may need to go into an acid free photographic sleeve, be encapsulated, go behind glass, hung in netting etc. This takes time and often needs consultation to ensure preservation of the object, display options, visitor experience and safety.

The committee members are also volunteers. It is their role to keep the museum open, welcoming, accessible and viable. There is all the usual secretarial and business administration associated with running any organisation. It is a huge responsibility! The committee also feels a great responsibility to preserve and honour the effort over many decades of the many former volunteers from the Stansbury community on whose foundation we build. Thank you to everyone for your continued support, for doing it willingly and making the museum a happy place to be a volunteer. Your commitment to the Stansbury Museum is very much appreciated"

The morning tea was relaxed, informal and fun with much laughter and lots of delicious food (thank you Ally, Jan and Lee). It was a successful get together of people with very different life experiences, backgrounds and ages, united in a shared purpose.


