### **Swimming Pontoons – Community Notice.**

Public Liability insurance is no longer available to any entity for the purpose of insuring pontoons. As such, the two swimming pontoons which are usually installed in Oyster Bay over the summer period, will not be put in place this year.

It is acknowledged that this is disappointing for both our local community and the many visitors who enjoy access to the pontoons over the summer. Communication with Yorke Peninsula Council and the Insurer is ongoing and if the situation changes regarding the availability of appropriate insurance, the decision will be reconsidered.

### TOWN LIGHTING.

Stansbury has numerous locations where there are safety lights installed (all solar) which are activated at night. These lights are in the following locations:

- Mills Gully.
- Centenary Park.
- Pine Park.
- Shelter Shed on the Foreshore (with the mosaic pelican) and the Shelter Shed at the Jetty (Murray's Vision).
- Town Entrance Sign.

Please note that, as these lights are all run on solar, at times they may appear to not be working in the early hours of the morning, particularly if the day prior has been cloudy and the sun has not had a chance to re-charge them.

As these lights are the responsibility of Stansbury Progress, if you notice a problem with any of them, please contact the Stansbury Visitor Information Centre and one of the ladies will pass the message onto Tidy Towns to rectify.

### **RECYCLING**



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

**Paper/Cardboard:** There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

**Bottles and cans:** Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

**Printer cartridges:** These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

### Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries. Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am-4pm.

### **Blister Packs**

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

I can't believe that this is the last Scribble for the 2024 and Christmas will be here soon. As well as a time for celebration, it is a time of reflection, of family, of holiday, of tradition and of memories of times past. Christmas has been celebrated for many hundreds of years.

The heart of Christmas is a religious celebration and over the years it has been surrounded by many traditions, religious, secular and commercial. It is part of our cultural heritage. It is no surprise then that there are some museums in the world devoted solely to Christmas.

In Rothenburg, Germany, the Christmas museum highlights the origin and development of German Christmas customs and displays historic Christmas trees and ornaments. The whole town embraces Christmas and has a reputation as the "Christmas capital of Germany" —It has a shop devoted entirely to Christmas and also has a Christmas market. In Salzburg, Austria, the Christmas Museum has exhibits of cultural and historic interest relating to Christmas from 1840 to 1940.

This year, several museums in London have specific events relating to Christmas including the Charles Dickens Museum. On Christmas Eve, the museum will be decorated in Victorian style and adaptations of Dickens famous "A Christmas Carol" will be playing whilst visitors are served mince pies and mulled wine.

I'm sure many of you can visualise the fire crackling in the hearth and the antique cards on the mantle piece, the holly and ivy and paper chain decorations festooned above and the sound of carollers in the background.

The United States even has several Santa museums (one boasts almost 5,000 Santas) which as well as focusing on Santa also features other Christmas themed displays of ornaments, music boxes, artwork and photos from all over the world.

Australia's only Christmas museum is in Sydney. It is at Nativity House, Horsley Park and uniquely over 600 nativity scenes from 60 different countries. In different styles the nativity scenes are made from many materials, from luxurious silk and precious metals to humbler but easily available materials like maize leaves, wood shavings and shells. It also has displays of antique Christmas cards and paintings.

My personal wish for Scribble readers' is to experience the peace and joy of Christmas throughout the year.

### **CHRISTMAS SURVIVAL GUIDE - For Those Struggling**

Christmastime can feel overwhelming, especially if you're living with suicidal thoughts. Remember, you don't have to face this time alone. Care for yourself with these tips:

### 1. Prioritize Your Well-Being

Your mental health is important. Take breaks when you need them. Listen to your emotions without judgment to acknowledge how you're feeling.

### 2. Practice Self-Care

Give yourself permission to slow down and focus on the basics. Taking care of yourself is a victory.

### 3. Let Go of Perfection

Let go of the idea of the "perfect" Christmas and focus on works for you. Taking care of your emotional well-being is more important than trying to meet societal or family pressures.

### 4. Seek Support

If you're with friends or family, share your feelings with someone you trust. If alone, connect with others – message a friend, join a community group, or call a helpline.

### 5. Create a Safety Plan

If suicidal thoughts become intense, contact a friend, family member, or a crisis line (see below). Write down reasons to hold on, and keep this close by so it's there if needed.

### 6. Celebrate Small Wins

Focus on surviving and honouring the little things – getting out of bed, eating a meal, or reaching out for support. Acknowledge it takes strength to keep going.
