RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries. Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am-4pm.

Blister Packs

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Thank you AGL Wattle Park Wind Farm Community Fund

The committee of the Stansbury Museum would like to extend our thanks and gratitude to the AGL Wattle Park Wind Farm Community Fund 2024/2025 for approving our application for a grant to purchase 3 pedestal fans to assist with air movement and cooling in our large rear shed. Our visitors and volunteers are already appreciating the difference that they are making.

I didn't ever anticipate choosing underwear as a topic for a Scribble article but my attention was grabbed when I was researching an old advertising display board that was donated by a regular visitor to the Stansbury caravan park. It shows a young woman in a peach coloured bra made by Maiden Form and is dated 1939. It ties in seamlessly with other peach coloured lingerie of a similar vintage in our clothing display. The bra is advertised as having "an adjustable back and precision fit for young figures".

Maiden Form was a company established in 1922 in Bayonne, New Jersey USA (later known as Maidenform). It was formed by a shop owner, the seamstress who worked for her and the seamstress's husband who interestingly was a sculptor. They wanted to improve the look of the dresses they sold, which were a contrast to the then current "flapper" style. Instead of the flattened flapper style, their dresses followed the natural shape of a woman's figure so a bra which supported and conformed to the breasts was needed. This successful company which still exists today exported to 115 countries including Australia where this advertising display board was used in a shop.

As an aside, the museum has a wonderful example of beaded flapper style dress —come and be amazed at the number and weight of the beads that adorn this dress.

Yet another historical aside, during World War 2 this company switched their manufacturing in order to contribute to the war effort and to use their expertise to make parachutes and pigeon vests. Whilst "pigeon vest" might conjure up all sorts of fun images in our minds, they had a very serious purpose. They were worn by paratroopers to transport pigeons on their chests. When they landed in a war zone, they released the pigeons to carry messages, sometimes behind enemy lines and under fire.

Some of these pigeons are credited with saving lives and were awarded medals. Two Australian pigeons were awarded the Dickin medal (often called the Victoria Cross for animals) for carrying messages in the Pacific during WW2. Their communication enabled help that saved the lives of a patrol surrounded by the enemy and under heavy fire and the crew and vital cargo on a ship that was floundering during a severe storm.

This article in some ways seems an odd topic but I think it illustrates how change and adapting create innovation.

Seeing and understanding how and why things develop are important aspects of history and are so interesting.
