STANSBURY MUSEUM

A function of your local Stansbury Museum of which not everyone is aware, is to archive and store historical records. These can be records relating to places e.g. Stansbury Scribbles and maps of our town and area over the years. They can be family histories and records. They can also be records of organisations like sports clubs (eg football, cricket, golf), churches (e.g. Stansbury Christian Church 1875 -2017, Stansbury Methodist Church 1877- present) and others like Stansbury Institute Committee and the Stansbury School. Some of the historical records are on display and others are stored but available to look at on request (either immediately or with some notice). Please don't hesitate to ask if you have a particular interest in any of these documents. The museum volunteers are only too happy to assist with access.

I recently had a visitor to the museum who was related to Pastor James Cornish, the first pastor of the Stansbury Christian Church. I was able to show him objects on display from the church, photos of the pastor, his wife and the church, old maps showing the lot numbers in the hundred of Dalrymple of both the church, and the farms, relating to his ancestors. The museum also had written information and records re his ancestors and the church. The museum holds history in many forms and with these we can build a historical picture of a person, place or organisation.

The museum recently acquired an amazing collection of historical records about the Stansbury Methodist Church. They are the Church Committee Minutes from 1877 – 1966 (3 books), the Sunday School Roll books from 1880 -1959, the Sunday School Teachers Minutes from 1882-1972 and Sunday School Annual reports from 1931 -1968/69. The majority of these are handwritten in neat and elaborate cursive using quite formal language.

The Methodist ministry in Stansbury began in 1874 with a visiting minister travelling on horseback and holding services in homes of Stansbury residents. Three years later at a meeting of the fledgling church, it was proposed and recorded in the Church Committee Minutes 1877 -1905 book that

“a church be built at Stansbury measuring 39ft (11.9m) by 25ft (7.6m) within, 15ft (4.6m) high, gable 12ft (3.7m)”.

The following excerpts are from the Sunday School Teachers Minute Book 1882-1927 concerning the annual Sunday School picnic and the church anniversary celebration.

March 19th 1913

It was proposed by H.B Pitt “that the lady teachers be the provisioning committee for the picnic”. Mrs Bowman proposed “that the gentlemen teachers and officers have the management of the picnic”, Mr Norseworthy proposed “that the sum of one pound be spent in prizes for children’s sports”. Mr A.E Bowman proposed that Messers A.H Sprigg and Mr W.G Natt be authorised to make the necessary arrangements re sports and the distribution of prizes for same”. Miss C Pitt proposed that the van leaves the church not later than 10am for the picnic ground.

April 25th 1913

It was resolved “that Anniversary be postponed until neighbourhood is cleared of diphtheria”.

How different was the subject and tone of the entries, only a month apart, reflecting what was happening in people's lives – from the excitement of planning a children's picnic to postponing anniversary celebrations until the threat of a contagious disease abated. Another recently acquired, handwritten letter by a local and dated 1914 confirms that the disease was still present in the community the following year. It mentions that the writer is writing on behalf of a mother who was tending her daughter who had diphtheria.

The Sunday School rolls are also very interesting. In 1917, there were 5 teachers, a superintendent and a secretary. There were 17 boys and 19 girls enrolled and by 1918 these numbers had increased to 20 boys and 25 girls. Many of the names on the roll, which are meticulously recorded with boys on one page and girls on the opposite page, are parents and grandparents of people currently living in Stansbury. In a booklet that celebrates 100 years of Methodism at Stansbury there is a photo of the 1918 kindergarten Sunday school class. It shows the teachers and the children sitting on chairs in a circle in their classroom which has pictures on the wall.

Cross references can be made from different sources in the museum. Some of us love the written word, others prefer visual displays, and others enjoy hands on and tactile experiences – the Stansbury Museum offers something for everyone.

We recently hosted the Minlaton District Probus Club members, and it was really something to hear “Wow !”, “I remember...”, “I’ve heard about but never seen before” as they enthusiastically explored the museum.

CHI KUNG (QI GONG)

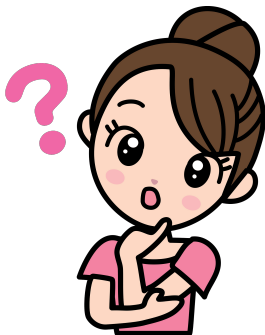
Chi Kung is a gentle form of energy practice. It is a beautiful flowing combination of

DON'T PANIC
"AusAlert" test on 27 July 2026 at 1:30pm ACST

The Commonwealth Government is currently working with all states and territories to build a new national messaging system, called **AusAlert**, which will become another tool emergency services can use to broadcast warnings to the community.

AusAlert uses cell broadcast technology to send emergency notifications to compatible devices within a defined geographic area. There is no app, no sign up and no phone number required. It is designed to notify you of emergencies like bushfires, floods, security threats, or severe health incidents.

This is a planned National test and no action is required. You do not need to call Triple Zero (000) unless you are experiencing a real emergency.

The test will occur across Australia, and anyone with a compatible smart device may receive an AusAlert notification.

The alert may make a loud siren-like sound, vibrate, and override silent or do-not-disturb settings. This is expected behaviour.

To avoid being disturbed, you will need to turn your mobile device off or switch it to aeroplane mode during the test window.

- This is a planned national test
- No action is required
- Do not call Triple Zero (000) unless there is a real emergency
- The alert may be loud – this is normal
- Not all devices may receive the test alert. If someone does not receive it, there is no action required from you
