It was very blustery towards the end of the market, and because of the extremely dry conditions, a dust storm clouded most of the southern peninsula. A huge thanks to all who helped with picking up rubbish, dismantling marquees, rescuing product and generally being caring and staying on to help anyone who needed an extra hand in the extreme weather conditions during the last half hour of the market. We can't thank you enough.

Overall, most stallholders overall were very happy with the morning's outcome and reported a fantastic day, despite the weather challenges.

Rob Tonkin, who generously donates his time and talents to all our markets busking for various charities, raised an incredible \$548 for the Royal Flying Doctor Service at the Easter Saturday market.

Rob, is a local and busks at every market and has done so for years, raised the following throughout this market season:

October: Prostate Cancer \$441.

NYE: RFDS \$691.30

January: Prostate Cancer \$367.35

March: Women's and Children's Hospital Foundation \$356.30

April: RFDS \$548

(The scheduled November market was cancelled).

Total for the season: \$2331.95.

The RFDS and Prostate Cancer funds go to the local support groups and not into general funds. This gives the local groups a say in how the money is spent, making sure that our community gets maximum benefit from the donations. Donations to the WCH support accommodation costs for country people who are needing to spend time in the city for sick children to attend hospital.

We are also very grateful for an anonymous sizeable cash donation for the RFDS at our Easter Market on Saturday 19 April.

SCRAP METAL COLLECTION MONTH – 1 MAY THROUGH TO 31 MAY.

The Stansbury Progress Association is aware that our Council does not offer any hard refuse collection for members of our community. While Progress is unable to offer hard refuse collection, we do believe that we can aid the community in this area by facilitating a **scrap metal recycling collection point in the town.**

On the Town map below, scrap metal can be dropped off in the clearly marked area at the end of the Oyster Point Drive Caravan Park, **anytime during the day between 1 and 31 May ONLY.** Please enter via the back gate marked on the map **NOT** through the park entrance.

Items that cannot be recycled: Mattresses, gas bottles, any tins or containers with liquid inside, no chemical bottles, no cushions or fabrics or whitegoods (at this stage).

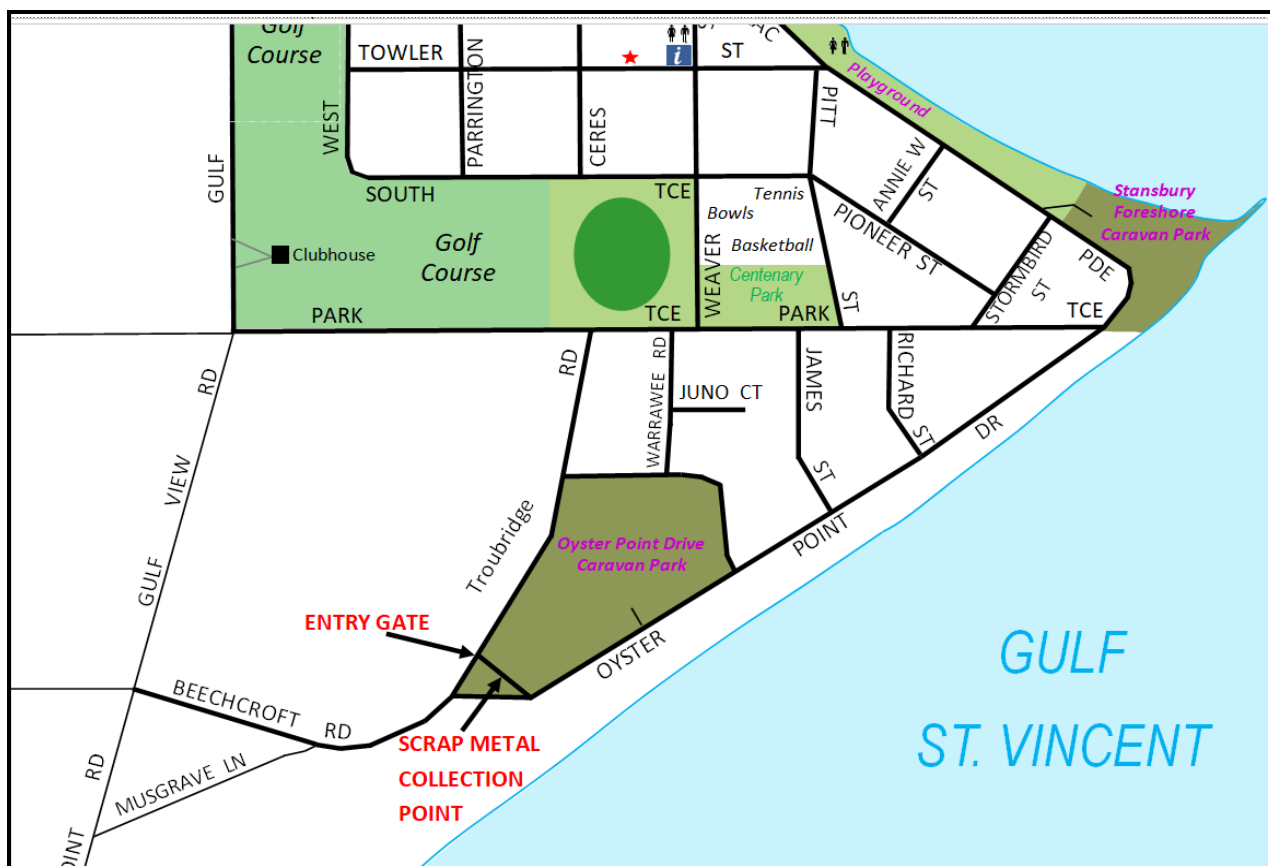
This initiative will enable you to clear scrap metal from your properties and Progress will dispose of it on your behalf. If the proceeds gained from the salvage exceed the expenses involved, the Progress Association will use these funds for the betterment of the community.

We must stress that this collection service can only be for scrap metal.

This is not an opportunity to dispose of general hard refuse. The Progress Association will evaluate the success of this operation with a view to possibly offering this service on an annual basis.

RECYCLING

To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the collection cages located around the town, or the blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am- 4pm.



Blister Packs

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

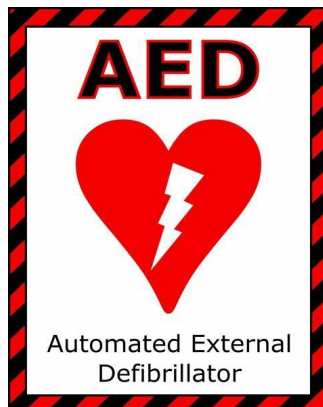

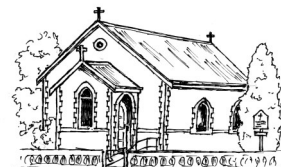

The traditional gunfire breakfast was served to over 80 people in the Institute supper room afterwards.

STANSBURY MUSEUM

When viewing news footage of events the humanitarian crisis in the Middle East and a night-club fire in Macedonia I noticed people wearing distinctive Red Cross vests. Also following Cyclone Alfred, the Australian Red Cross launched an appeal for funds. The Australian Red Cross has 110 years experience in supporting people in their most difficult times. With 16,000 members and volunteers, it acts locally and connects globally. It belongs to the world's largest humanitarian network -the International Red Cross and Red Crescent organisation.

These brought to mind the Stansbury Museum display that highlights the Stansbury Red Cross Circle and the Stansbury Voluntary Service Detachment, a division of the Australian Red Cross Society. During World War 2, both of these branches actively participated in supporting people during those uncertain and difficult times.

The Stansbury Red Cross Circle's object was to provide garments, comforts and other articles for people in hospital due to war conditions. Money was raised to send to Red Cross headquarters to purchase basic necessities, locally for purchasing wool and material to make items like knitted socks, hot water bottle covers and pyjamas and also to support a special Prisoner of War fund. Dances, Baby Competitions and Miss Red Cross Competitions were held. Catering was done and collection boxes were rattled all whilst membership fees were collected regularly. Some of these fundraising efforts served dual purposes. They supported 'unknown others' but also provided light relief and social connection for our local community in what were worrying and uncertain times for all and especially for those with family serving overseas. This group was at its zenith in 1941 when 73 women, men and children were in the group. By 1946 understandably interest had waned somewhat but importantly the Circle sponsored the Mothers and Babies Health Association. It closed down in 1960 but was revived in 1967 as the Stansbury Red Cross which once again fundraised with a myriad of social events like a successful Red Cross Golf Day and BBQ tea in 1975 which raised \$114. Stansbury Red Cross went into recess in 1990.

The Stansbury Voluntary Service Detachment was formed in 1940 to train personnel to render first aid if enemy action occurred in Australia. The doctor and nursing staff of the Yorketown Hospital ran the training. A First Aid Post was set up at the Stansbury Recreation Ground. Ingenious recycling by a local man turned a wooden gelignite explosives box into a sturdy first aid box with ornate coffin handles. You can see this box in our display. Four local VSD members (Red Cross aids), each did three week stints at Kapara in Glenelg which was a Red Cross convalescent home for servicemen. These Red Cross Aids also gave demonstrations of their skills to the local community. A 1940 newspaper cutting lists the names of the Stansbury VSD members who sat and all passed their exams. Notably of the surnames listed were names that we come across in the area today. On display is the uniform complete with shoulder bag of one of those volunteers. You can learn more about their contribution to our community in the history room at the museum.

Amongst the many other items in the Red Cross display cabinet are items from the first aid kits with brand names that many of us will know like Elastoplast, Murlex, Solypol, Johnson and Johnson, but certainly in different packaging reflective of the 1940's. One of the items is a box containing "First Aid Requisites – a comprehensive range of medicants – all valuable in first aid. Included were Smelling Salts, Sal Volatile and Castor Oil which no doubt brings back memories for many of us. For those who don't recognise them, smelling salts and sal volatile were stimulant compounds used to help revive someone who had fainted or felt unwell – the strong ammonia smell triggers an inhalation reflex. Castor oil is a natural laxative. In days gone by, mothers regularly dosed their children with this terrible tasting oil much to their disgust. The museum has another great display of formerly used medical products in our retail shop display which is in one of the small sheds. There is an amazing range of products. One of them, we have multiple iterations of over the years. Rawleigh's Salve was an antiseptic salve that was sold door to door. It had numerous advertising messages including "A Friend of the Family since 1889" and "For Man or Beast". It was very popular, not least in rural communities where it literally covered all of the "family".
