CHI KUNG (QI GONG)



RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available: **Nespresso pods**: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around</u> <u>the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection.

Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am-4pm.

Blister Packs

Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.





STANSBURY PRIMARY SCHOOL NEWS

Over the last two terms our learners with the support of Letitia Dahl-helm, Environmental Officer from the council have been spending time in the space opposite the school. During this time, they have observed what is currently there and reflected on what it may have been like to live there as a Narungga person before colonisation, thinking about food, shelter and how they may have used the plants. The children named the space Seaside Pines and in Nharrunga it is Dhandi (sea) side Pines.

When asked what could we do in this area, the children suggested reintroducing more flora and went about researching and determining what species they wanted to revegetate. Council provided the plants, tools, guards, stakes and water, which we thank. We were concerned about revegetating so late in the year but Letitia reassured us that because they were natives and that they are going to receive regular water for the next 6 weeks that they will get a great start. The children loved their time planting and were so engaged as the older students supported our younger learners...the quote of the day came from Lewis (year 6), "That was really fun". It was a beautiful day to have fun all the while learning about the whole process of revegetation. This is only the beginning as we listen and act upon other ideas from our learners in 2025 and continue to develop Dhandiside Pines.

The Stansbury museum committee and its volunteers would like to acknowledge and thank the Yorke Peninsula Council for awarding the Stansbury Museum a grant under the 2024/2025 Community Grant Scheme. This has allowed the purchase and installation of a reverse cycle air conditioner for the History room which will make this a more comfortable room for visitors and volunteers alike when temperatures are extreme. The air conditioner was purchased at Minlaton Betta Home Living. It was efficiently and thoughtfully installed by Kim's Electronics staff with respect for the exhibits in the area.

DO YOU HAVE!

Does anyone have a group photo of the 1990 Stansbury School Welfare Club Deb Ball? We would like to add it (or a copy) to others in our collection.

RECENT ADDITIONS

We have recently had several quite old books donated to the museum that had been owned by members of a family who had lived in the Stansbury area for many years. Their topics cover practicalities like woodworking techniques of 1957 as well as cooking and home making. A "Friend in the Kitchen or What to Cook and How to Cook It" is a small cookbook published in 1907 in Victoria and has 2 interesting observations in the title page. "There is religion in a good loaf of bread" and my particular favourite," Bad cooking diminishes happiness and shortens life" No wonder a "friend in the kitchen" was required. There is a classic black and white illustration of a woman with a frilled white apron over her long sleeved long dress with a white mob cap standing in front of her large wood oven range with heavy cast iron pots and amongst the items on the shelf above is her iron which was likely a solid iron (sadiron) heated on the range.

The donated books also relate to spiritual and religious matters. One is a "confirmation handbook' which was presented to the recipient in 1937 on the occasion of her confirmation at St Augustine's Church, Stansbury.

The "gem" of this group of books is a magnificent old Bible which will be displayed in the sitting room. It is a Pronouncing Parallel Bible from the early 1890's containing 2 versions of the bible (King James and Revised) side by side for easy comparison. This large "family style bible" has so much more than just bible text. It includes a Bible Dictionary, "Bible Aids for Social and Private Prayer and curiously, Manners and Customs of the Ancients. It has 2,000 illustrations and even has slots for family photos. Its embossed and gilded maroon leather cover attests to the importance that this type of bible held –it was literally a show piece.

The museum has also had the privilege of being able to hang a pencil drawn portrait of a young girl. She is the ancestor of a local family whose cousin became an artist of some renown, reputedly having had work exhibited in the Adelaide Art Gallery. The artist used to regularly visit the farm around the time of the Minlaton Show. This delicate portrait is especially poignant as the subject, Ruby passed away in 1908 when she was 16.

Another hat has been added to our hat collection. It is a "cabbage tree hat". It is an example of an iconic hat made and worn by early settlers in Australia –the first distinctive Australian hat even earlier than the uniquely Aussie cork hat. It is made from the leaves of the cabbage –tree palm which are unusually long and thin and so easily woven. The style has a wide brim so was practical and cool. In colonial times, cabbage tree hats were worn by most working men shepherds, bullockies, horsemen, squatters, convicts, soldiers and bushrangers. In the 1830's and 40's, there were groups of high spirited, disaffected youths named the Cabbage Tree Mob and Cabbage Tree Blackguards who all wore cabbage tree hats to symbolise their unity -not unlike the Mods and Rockers of the 1960's whose fashion identified them.

You never know what treasures you will find at the Stansbury museum! There is something for everyone! Come and be surprised, excited and delighted!

It was after the Edithburgh fire that I first spoke to the Stansbury CFS captain to see if there was a role I could play at the local brigade. He immediately signed me up for the next training, and I've ridden on the truck ever since. I may not be the fastest or strongest on the fire ground, but it's not always about speed and strength. Sometimes I'm holding a traffic sign, sometimes I'm giving directions, sometimes I'm helping SAAS with a patient.

Right now my family and work commitments demand a lot of my time, but I've never felt pressured to attend every incident. As volunteers we are encouraged to take care of our own welfare and mental health. I attend as many incidents as I can and play whatever part I am able to when there. I also try to assist with any community engagement activities, and helping Santa on Christmas Eve is a highlight. Our family farm is close to town, and the CFS are often called to accidents, trees down, and occasionally fires in that area. To date we've been fortunate, but if ever my family or the farm is involved I want to know that help can come from Stansbury, just 6 minutes away. I hope this will continue to be possible for many years to come.
