RECYCLING



To help keep our town beautiful and reduce waste the following recycling facilities are available:

Nespresso pods: Used **Nespresso pods only** can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre into the box located by the front door.

Paper/Cardboard: There is a large white plastic cube in the yard at the Visitor Centre (entrance off Towler Street). Dry, flat packed newspapers, magazines (both secured with string) and cardboard can be placed in this cube. If the cube is full, please leave the paper bundles under the veranda.

No hypodermic needles please.

Bottles and cans: Bottles and cans can be placed into the <u>collection cages located around the town</u>, or the <u>blue and yellow bins in the caravan parks</u>. Proceeds are distributed to the various local community groups and sporting clubs who participate in their collection. Alternately Stansbury Recycling has a bottle and can depot for all your refundable items and glass bottles.

Printer cartridges: These can be deposited into the Planet Ark box located near the front door of the Visitor Centre.

Yellow Bin

As a reminder of what to put in the yellow kerb side recycling bin, we now have large fridge magnets from Green Industries.

Pick up your free magnet from the Visitor Centre weekdays 9.30am-4pm.

Blister Packs


Empty blister packs can be dropped off at the Visitor Centre in our designated box. Blister packs only, no plastic bags or cardboard.

Battery Recycling

Battery recycling is available at the Stansbury IGA. Just ensure that the terminals have tape over them before placing in the box.

STANSBURY MUSEUM

I was recently reading a collection of letters relating to the apprenticeship of a 16 year old boy from London to a farmer in the Stansbury area under the Barwell scheme. It set me thinking about the contribution this lad named Maurice and his descendants had made to the Stansbury community.

Over the years and indeed it continues today, Stansbury has been settled by people of many nations and cultures. Each brings their own unique skills and contribution to the community. Take for example, Pastor Christian Gottlieb Teichelmann who came with his family to Stansbury in 1872. This fascinating man was born and educated in Germany as a carpenter and then as a Lutheran missionary. As one of the first missionaries to come to South Australia, he worked amongst the Kaurna Aboriginal people of the Adelaide Plains. In 1841, he famously co wrote with a colleague, a unique book of their language which is lauded as the most comprehensive documentation of the Kaurna language of the time.

When he came to Stansbury, he built the first shop in Stansbury selling flour, sugar etc and he also acted as the first Post Master. He started the first Sunday School in his own home. He was a founding member of the Stansbury Methodist Church and laid the foundation stone in 1877. His descendants live in Stansbury and surrounding areas today. Even Stansbury "locals" originally came from elsewhere.

Stansbury Museum is great place to discover more about how our community has been enriched in so many ways by people from all over the world. A good way to get to know about many of these interesting people is to volunteer at the museum and immerse yourself in the history of Stansbury.


